POSITION DESCRIPTION/SCOPE OF WORK: This position will expose the incumbent to various aspects of cold-water fish culture and facility maintenance at a fish hatchery. The Yellowstone River Trout Hatchery is a brood facility that is responsible for producing Yellowstone cutthroat, Arctic grayling and Golden trout for the state of Montana. For 2024, we will be conducting some wild spawning operations for all three species. We will also be stocking our annual fish in Montana

waters throughout the summer and early fall. The incumbent will be responsible for maintenance projects at the facility as well. These projects will include painting, pruning, mowing & trimming hatchery lawns, possibly some landscaping, tree removal and general building maintenance. Some weekend work may be involved as well.
