With the Montana elk and deer drawing having just passed, a topic that is top of mind is the upcoming fall hunting season.

The last several years it feels like the distribution of hunters has been a problem. One change that would greatly help this issue is to change how the Non-Resident General tag process is conducted. If we were to set non-resident general tag sub quotas for each region this would ensure that not all 17,000 non-residents do not end up in the same unit in southwest Montana (which is what it currently feels like).

For examples of this general tag allocation strategy you can look at nearly every other western state. Idaho and Wyoming are great examples of how this process works to help more evenly distribute hunters on the landscape.

I hope you will consider this as worthy legislation to take up, vote yes on, and improve the quality of our outdoor recreation.
