**Agenda Item:** Proposed 2011 Fall Upland Game Bird Quotas and Limits

**Division:** Wildlife

**Action Needed:** Approval of Final Quotas/Limits

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### **Background**

Upland game bird season dates for 2011 were finalized in February 2010. Other season elements include bag and possession limits. While limits seldom change from year to year, Adaptive Harvest Management for sage grouse annually assess populations and bag limits. AHM recommends a conservative two-bird bag limit if average lek counts are below the long-term average of about 30 males/lek on nearly 90 pre-selected leks. There is also a provision for not opening the season based on consistently low average lek counts (45% or more below long-term average) over a three-year period. If the average count exceeds the long term average, AHM recommends a standard four-bird bag limit.

Heightened public awareness surrounding sage grouse, and likely habitat impacts from energy development, resulted in the commission adopting a conservative two-bird bag limit in 2007, a year of above-average lek counts (33.6 males/lek). This high level of public awareness continues with the March 5, 2010 “warranted but precluded” listing by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The two-bird bag limit was maintained in 2008 and 2009 with annual survey averages of 22.9 and 23.3 males/lek for 2008 and 2009 respectively.

The 2010 lek surveys resulted in an average of 20.5 males/lek (12% decline from 2009; 69% of the long term average). While this represented a third consecutive year below the long term average, the 2010 result is within the range of observations recorded since 1980 and at the statewide level is above the closure trigger of three consecutive years at 45% or more below the long term average. The conservative two-bird bag and twice the daily bag possession limit for sage grouse was maintained in 2010.

2011 lek surveys (unfinished at the time of initial introduction) revealed a 6% decline from 2010 to 19.2 males per lek. This equates to approximately 34% of the long term average. At the statewide level this is above the closure trigger of three consecutive years at 45% or more below the long term average. As such, the conservative two-bird bag and twice the daily bag possession limit for sage grouse is again proposed for 2011. Given the current population trend, potential adjustments to hunting area boundaries may be proposed in December.

Reflecting the typically static nature of upland bird bag and possession limits as supported by biology and management history, all other upland game bird bag, possession limits and permit quotas are proposed unchanged from 2010 or as otherwise finalized during season structure changes in February 2010. This includes staff consideration of fall turkey permits.

### **Public Involvement Process & Results**

Public comment ran through 5:00 PM Monday, June 20. One comment was received and will be delivered to the Commission for their consideration of any final decision scheduled for the July 14 meeting.

### **Alternatives and Analysis**

Status and species biology does not require more conservative limits at this time. However, if downward trends continue for some species additional restrictions may be warranted in the future.

### **Agency Recommendation & Rationale**

Recommend maintaining 2010 bag and possession limits and permit quotas for all upland game birds. This is consistent with known biology, management history and survey efforts to date. Season dates were previously set.

### **Proposed Motion**

I move to adopt the final 2011 upland game bird bag and possession limits and permit quotas as presented by FWP.
