**Hunting Access Dates: September 1, 2016 – May 31, 2017**

### GENERAL INFORMATION

Weyerhaeuser Company in partnership with Region 1 Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks (FWP) welcomes the responsible use of its timberlands by the public for noncommercial recreation such as hunting, fishing and camping. Logging and forestry activities are ongoing however, and may pose a danger. Please adhere to the following regulations when using Weyerhaeuser lands in Region 1.

### REGULATIONS

1. Weyerhaeuser restricts road use with gates, barricades, earthen barriers or signs. This may be a restriction on roads owned by Weyerhaeuser or a restriction on roads that are cooperatively owned, such as a road cost-shared with the Forest Service. A cooperative road management sign identifies the intended restriction.
2. A gate, whether opened or closed, with no sign is a year-round closure to all motorized vehicles.
3. Road restrictions apply behind unmarked gates, even if the gate is vandalized or open.
4. For a road to be open behind a gate, it must be specifically designated by a sign as open.
5. An earthen barrier without a sign is considered a closure to all motorized vehicles, except snowmobiles between December 1 and April 1.
6. Gates must not be blocked. Administrative, contractors or emergency traffic may need to pass through.
7. All "off-road" motorized vehicle use is prohibited.
8. Hunting, transportation of hunters or game retrieval with administrative or commercial vehicles is prohibited behind a closure.
9. Camping is limited to 14 days per campsite. During this time, the campsite must not be left unattended for more than 3 consecutive days. Camping beyond 14 days requires relocating to a new site at least 5 miles from the original site. A permit is required for "Exception" and "Special Use" camping.

10. Cutting trees is not permitted and a permit is required for cutting firewood.
11. Commercial activity, including trapping and woodcutting is not permitted on Weyerhaeuser lands without a Weyerhaeuser Special Use Permit.
12. Littering is prohibited. Pack out all garbage and leave the area clean.
13. Recreational wolf trapping is allowed. Wolf trappers must register at local FWP Regional offices with; name, trapping location – (T/R/S) and phone #. No trapping on active logging and road construction projects (if machinery is in the area, it is closed to trapping). A 150-foot setback is required for foothold traps from all open or gated roads and hiking trails. Foothold traps are prohibited within 1,000 feet of all residences and trailheads.
14. Failure to abide by these regulations can result in a trespass violation under MCA 45-6-203 and/or a violation of FWP Department or Commission orders or rules under MCA 87-6-201.


