Region 2 Block Management Lands

Hunting Access Dates: September 1, 2016 – May 31, 2017

The Department of Natural Resources and Conservation (DNRC) along with Region 2 FWP, welcomes the responsible use of the block of DNRC land depicted on the accompanying map by the public for non-commercial recreation such as hunting, fishing and camping. However, please be aware that forestry and cattle grazing may be ongoing. When recreating on DNRC-Potomac lands, please abide by the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. To legally hunt, fish or trap on DNRC lands, users must possess a current-year Conservation License. Trappers must also obtain a "Special Recreational Use License" from DNRC. All other general recreational users must obtain a State Land Recreational Use License, which can be purchased at any state license provider.
2. Motorized vehicle use:
 - All "off-road" motorized vehicle use is prohibited.
 - DNRC restricts motorized road use behind gates, barricades, earthen barriers and signs.
 - A gate, whether opened or closed, with no sign posted is a year-round closure to all motorized vehicles.
 - Road restrictions apply behind unmarked gates, even if the gate is vandalized or open.
 - For a road to be open to motorized use behind a gate, it must be specifically designated by a sign as open.
 - An earthen barrier without a sign is considered a closure to all motorized vehicles.
 - Snowmobile use is permitted in all areas unless specifically signed as closed.
 - Gates must not be blocked. Administrative, contractor or emergency traffic may need to pass through.
 - Hunting, transportation of hunters or game retrieval with administrative or commercial vehicles is prohibited behind a closure.
3. Camping is limited to 16 days during any 28-day period. During this time, the campsite must not be left unattended for more than 3 consecutive days.
4. Overnight horseback use is allowed on DNRC-Potomac BMA lands. Certified weed-free hay is required.
5. To minimize conflicts with bears: Human, pet and livestock food, garbage, game meat, carcass parts and all other attractants shall be stored at all times in accordance with FWP's Wildlife Management Area Food Storage Order. (available at fwp.mt.gov) Attractants shall not be buried, discarded or burned in an open campfire.
6. Trapping, firewood cutting as well as mineral, rock and artifact collecting requires special authorization from DNRC.
7. Littering is prohibited. Pack out all garbage and leave the area clean.
8. Failure to abide by these regulations can result in a trespass violation under MCA 45-6-203 and/or a violation of FWP Department or Commission orders or rules under MCA 87-6-201.


