Hunter Access Dates: September 1 - October 16 and October 29 – November 20, 2016

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Maclay Ranch Block Management Area (BMA) is located 2 miles southwest of Lolo. Hunting on about 680 acres is provided by a private landowner.

This BMA provides hunters with access to adjacent state and federal lands, as well as hunting opportunities for white-tailed deer, mule deer, elk, black bear, wolf and mountain grouse.

PERMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Written permission is required to hunt on this BMA, and hunter numbers are limited. Up to 2 hunters will be granted access per day. Each hunter may reserve no more than 3 days at a time and may not make further reservations until their hunting period is completed.

ARCHERY & UPLAND BIRD SEASONS

September 1 - October 16, 2016

Reservations for permission will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis by calling the Region 2 Hunting Access Office (406) 542-5530. Reservations begin **Monday, August 22 at 8:00 am** and will continue Monday - Friday, 8 am-5 pm.

GENERAL RIFLE SEASON

October 29 – November 20, 2016

Permission will be administered by random drawing through the Region 2 FWP Hunting Access office. To enter the drawing, call (406) 542-5530 during business hours (8 a.m. - 5 p.m.) on **Wednesday, October 5th**. Be prepared to leave your name, address, phone number, ALS number and your 1st, 2nd and 3rd choice of hunting dates on the voicemail. Successful hunters will be notified the following week.

- Up to 2 hunters will be granted access per day.
- Hunters may reserve no more than 3 days at a time, and may not make further reservations until they have completed their hunting period.
- Hunters will be issued two permission slips: **While hunting be sure to place one permission slip face up on the dash of your vehicle and keep the other with you while hunting.**

HOW TO GET THERE

From Lolo; drive south on US Highway 93 approximately 3 miles.

➔ Turn right (west) onto Rowan Road, which leads to the parking area at the end of Dundee Road. It is about a ½-mile walk uphill across the pasture to reach the hunting area as shown on the accompanying map.

REGULATIONS

1. There is no hunting in the **NO SHOOTING ZONE** on the lower portion of the Maclay Ranch BMA, see the accompanying map. Please be aware of residential areas located around this BMA.
2. One hunting partner may accompany you, but they are not allowed hunt. Both of you are required to wear hunter orange during the rifle season.
3. Non-motorized travel only. Access is from the **PARKING AREA** on Dundee Road. Motor vehicle use for game retrieval is not allowed. Use of game carts, bicycles, or pack stock is permitted.
4. Do not park any vehicle in such a way as to obstruct traffic. **DO NOT BLOCK GATES.**
5. Camping is not allowed on this BMA.
6. It is unlawful to commercially outfit on this BMA.
7. Failure to abide by the regulations for this BMA can result in a trespass violation under MCA 45-6-203 and/or a violation of FWP Department or Commission orders or rules under MCA 87-6-201.


