

REGULATIONS

1. MANDATORY FOOD STORAGE ORDER:

To minimize conflicts with bears: Human, pet & livestock food, beverages, garbage, game meat, carcass parts and all other forms of attractants shall be stored at all times in accordance with FWP's *Wildlife Management Area Food Storage Order*, available at fwp.mt.gov. Attractants shall NOT be buried, discarded or burned in an open campfire.

2. Motorized vehicle travel is not allowed on this BMA, except on the public roads and designated parking areas shown on the accompanying map. NOTE: Landowners in the course of administrative work and federal, state and county officials in the course of their official duties will be exempt from these vehicle restrictions.

3. Parking along Sunset Hill Road and road right-of-way is prohibited by Missoula County Resolution 2001-057. All access to the Blackfoot BMA from the Sunset Hill Road shall only be from one of four designated parking areas as shown on the accompanying map.

4. Non-motorized travel is open only to foot, horseback or non-motorized bicycle.

5. Do not park vehicles in such a manner as to obstruct traffic. Do not block gates.

6. Camping is allowed on DNRC, UM, TNC and most BLM land.

Exceptions: Camping is not allowed on private land and camping is not allowed on the BLM land in the Bear Creek Flat area (this camping prohibition includes all BLM land in Sections 1, 2, 11 and 12, of T14N, R14W).

Where camping is allowed on this BMA, it is limited to no more than 16 days during any 28-day period. Both the 16 -day and the 28-day period start the first day the camp and/or camping gear is on-site.

Following the 16-day camp period, persons may not relocate a camp within the Blackfoot BMA until the 28-day period has lapsed.

Upon the end of the 16-day camping period, all camps must be completely removed. This includes the removal of all property. The state's litter laws will be enforced if any refuse is left behind.

7. Hunters using horses and pack stock are required to use certified weed-free hay on this BMA.

8. Do not enter or shoot into Safety (No Trespassing) Zones. There may be safety zones posted on this BMA that are not indicated on the accompanying map. If an injured animal crosses into a safety zone, *do not follow it*. A game warden or designated FWP personnel must accompany you if it is necessary to retrieve game within a safety zone.

9. It is unlawful to commercially outfit on this BMA.

10. Failure to abide by the regulations for this BMA can result in a trespass violation under MCA 45-6-203 and/or a violation of FWP Department or Commission orders or rules under MCA 87-6-201.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Blackfoot Block Management Area (BMA) is located in Missoula and Powell Counties, about 35 miles east of Missoula. Hunting on approximately 46,417 acres is provided by private landowners, Bureau of Land Management (BLM), University of Montana (UM) Lubrecht Experimental Forest, Montana Nature Conservancy (TNC) and Montana Department of Natural Resources and Conservation (DNRC).

This BMA offers hunting opportunities for white-tailed deer, mule deer, elk, black bear, wolf and mountain grouse.

ELK RIFLE HUNTING IS ONLY ALLOWED OCTOBER 22 – NOVEMBER 27.

PERMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Permission is not required to hunt on this BMA. See accompanying "Regulations" on back page.

HOW TO GET THERE


From Missoula, go east on Interstate Highway 90 about 4 miles; take Bonner exit #109 and drive northeasterly on MT Highway 200 to:

➔ Sunset Hill Road located off of MT 200 between mile-markers 24 and 25, and again between mile-markers 31 and 32.

➔ Sperry Grade Road located off MT 200 between mile-markers 33 and 34.

➔ An unmarked road located off MT Highway 200, just east of mile-marker 39 ("River Junction Fishing Access Site" sign), which accesses Chamberlain Creek and River Junction areas.
