

Regulations for

MARCUM-KERSHAW MOUNTAINS BMA #28

Deer/Elk Hunting District: 281

Black Bear Management Unit: 280

Hunting Access Dates: September 1 - November 27, 2016

GENERAL INFORMATION

Marcum-Kershaw Mountains Block Management Area (BMA) is located in Powell County between Ovando and Lincoln, about 60 miles east of Missoula by road. Hunting on about 16,436 acres in this BMA is provided by private landowners, US Bureau of Land Management, US Fish & Wildlife Service and Montana Department of Natural Resources and Conservation (DNRC).

This BMA offers hunting opportunities for elk, mule deer, white-tailed deer, black bear, wolf and mountain grouse.

PERMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Permission is not required to hunt on this BMA.

HOW TO GET THERE

On Interstate Highway 90 about 4 miles east of Missoula, take Bonner exit #109. Drive east about 52 miles on MT Highway 200 to the following access points on the north side of MT 200:

►Coopers Lake Road between mile markers 52 and 53 on MT 200 look for the "Coopers Lake/Big Nelson Campground" sign at the turn. Access to western portion of BMA.

►Unnamed loop road (in section 30) 5 miles up Coopers Lake Road. Access to northern portion of BMA.

►Arrastra Creek Road between mile markers 57 and 58. Access to central portion of the BMA.

►Patterson Prairie Road between mile markers 63 and 64. Access to eastern portion of BMA.

REGULATIONS

1. Motorized vehicle travel is only allowed on roads listed as "County or other public road" or "Designated BMA Travel Route" on the accompanying map. Travel off-road or on closed roads is open only to foot, horse or non-motorized bicycle. Hunters should park along open roads and be prepared to retrieve game by nonmotorized methods.

2. Do not park any vehicle in such a manner as to obstruct traffic or block any gate.
3. Do not enter Safety (No Hunting, No Shooting Zones). There may be Safety Zones that are not indicated on this BMA map.
4. Camping is allowed on public lands within this BMA. Camping on private lands requires land-owner permission.

Camping is limited to a total of not more than 16 days during any 28-day period. (The 16 total days do not need to be consecutive.) Both the 16-day and the 28-day periods start the first day the camp and/or camp gear is on-site. Following the 16-days of camping, persons may not relocate a camp within the described Marcum-Kershaw Mountains BMA until the 28-day period has lapsed. Upon the end of the 16th day of camping, all camps must be completely removed. The state's litter laws will be enforced if any refuse is left.

7. It is unlawful to commercially outfit on this BMA.
8. Failure to abide by the regulations for this BMA can result in a trespass violation under MCA 45-6-203 and/or a violation of FWP Department or Commission orders or rules under MCA 87-6-201.


