

CHAIN BUTTES #32

DEER/ELK HD 410 & ANTELOPE HD 481 (REVISED 2016)

This area is intended to provide a quality hunting experience; minimize conflicts between sportsmen and landowners; and reduce impacts to soil, watershed and scenic values. Hunting opportunities available include all general season big game and upland game birds.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

These rules and regulations will take effect on September 1, and end automatically on December 1, each year.

1. DO NOT PARK OR CAMP IN FRONT OF ANY GATES OR WITHIN 100 ft TO EITHER SIDE OF GATES.
2. All off-road vehicle travel is prohibited. All roads not identified on this map as either open or authorized for game retrieval only, are closed to all motorized vehicle use. Big game retrieval is allowed between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. daily on all retrieval roads, which are posted with road closed signs. Prior to or after these hours, motorized vehicles are not permitted on closed roads.
3. For information regarding access for persons with a disability on seasonally closed roads on BLM lands within this Cooperative Management Area (CMA), please contact the Lewistown BLM Field Office. (see below for contact information)
4. All public land in this management area is open to walk-in hunting.
5. The private land participating in this BMA is open to walk-in hunting unless marked "closed" with orange paint or a posted sign (around residential areas, shipping pastures, etc.) For those parcels of private property identified as **Non-BMA** areas on this map, the state law requiring landowner permission is applicable.
6. Camping on all private property participating within this BMA will be allowed in accordance with rules established for camping on all public lands within this BMA (See rule 7). If a cooperator wishes to grant an exception to this rule then it will be documented in a written, detailed manner to include the specific location of the camp and specific dates the camp will be present. This exception must also contain the authorizing cooperator's signature.
7. Camping is permitted on all public lands. Within this BMA the following rules apply to camping on DNRC (state) as well as BLM lands: Individual(s) may not occupy the same campsite on public lands more than 16 days during a 30 day period; camp must be located within 100 yards of open roads; direct access by motor vehicle is permitted to and from campsites using the most direct route to avoid damage to soils and vegetation; at the end of the 16 day period, individuals MUST relocate ½ mile away from the currently occupied campsite.
8. Use of state land is governed by Department of Natural Resources and Conservation (DNRC) regulations. Horses cannot be kept on State lands overnight. No open fires allowed on DNRC or private lands.
9. Livestock - Outfitters and other recreationists must use certified weed -seed free hay for their livestock when used on BLM and DNRC land.
10. No fireworks or exploding targets are allowed on any lands within this BMA

These regulations apply to everyone using public land, except for emergency or administrative use by official vehicles. Lessees or Permittees of the public lands involved must obtain approval from the authorized officer prior to using a vehicle in any manner not described in these rules and regulations.

PENALTIES:

Any person who fails to comply with these off-road vehicle regulations may be subject to federal, state and local penalties as applicable. Federal penalties as found in 43 CFR 8360.0-7 include a fine up to \$1,000 and / or imprisonment not to exceed 12 months.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES:

Quickly reporting violators to the appropriate authorities and constant peer pressure can improve the behavior of everyone using the outdoors.


Always leave the property cleaner than you found it. Carry a plastic garbage sack for your litter, as well as any other litter you may find during your hunt. Dispose of it in the proper manner. Bury all human waste.

Many times in the early fall, fire conditions can be very critical. If necessary, emergency restriction will be posted and the public is responsible for being aware of and complying with same. Always park your vehicle where it will not be sitting over highly combustible vegetation because catalytic converters on vehicles can create enough heat to start range or forest fires.
