

C Lazy E Ranch Block Management Area #154 2016

Hunters, Please be aware of weeds. Noxious weeds threaten your hunting future by destroying critical wildlife habitat and jeopardizing future hunting access. Avoid parking, walking or driving in weeds, **it is suggested that vehicles be washed before and after hunting!**

A written permission slip from the landowner is not required. Permission can be obtained by signing in at one of the roster boxes (see map). **Every hunter must fill out a coupon daily before hunting.** Hunter portion of the coupon must be visibly displayed on the vehicle dash. Please return hunter portion of the coupon when done hunting.

Primary hunting opportunities: Mule deer (HD 502) and upland birds. BMA is open to hunting of all legal game species.

WALK-IN ONLY: Vehicles may be parked along county road. This includes ATVs and motorcycles.

Vehicles will be parked in such a manner as to not obstruct traffic or block any gate.

No camping or open fires allowed, no smoking outside vehicle, leave all gates as you find them.

Firearms shall not be discharged within 1/4 mile of an inhabited building located within the boundaries of the BMA without permission of the inhabitant.


These regulations shall be in effect from September 1 through January 1. Access to private lands outside of this time period will be at the discretion of the landowner.

BMA restrictions do not apply to legally accessible public lands within the BMA boundaries. Abide by managing agency's regulations.
