

Diamond X Farms Block Management Area #63 2016

Hunters, Please be aware of weeds. Noxious weeds threaten your hunting future by destroying critical wildlife habitat and jeopardizing future hunting access. Avoid parking, walking or driving in weeds, **it is suggested that vehicles be washed before and after hunting!**

Written permission is required on the first visit. Hunters must call ahead to reserve a slot and sign in at a roster box **on all visits**. Permission must be obtained in advance by calling 348-3162 (beginning August 22). Telephone calls accepted only between 5:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. (Tuesdays and Wednesdays are the best days). Permission slips will be issued at ranch headquarters (see map).

Primary hunting opportunities: Upland birds and waterfowl. BMA is open to hunting of all legal game species.

Walk-in only. Vehicles permitted on roads as instructed by landowner. Vehicles may be parked at designated parking areas. This includes ATVs and motorcycles.

Vehicles will be parked in such a manner as to not obstruct traffic or block any gate.

No camping or open fires allowed, no smoking outside vehicle, leave all gates closed.


Use extreme caution when hunting near houses, buildings and livestock. Know your target and beyond.

These regulations shall be in effect from September 1 through January 15. Access to private lands outside of this time period will be at the discretion of the landowner.
