

Online Hunter Education Field Day Requirements

Effective July 10, 2018 students will be required to:

- Be pre-registered for the field day
- Present their **Certificate of Successful Completion** of the Online Course at check-in
- Present a picture ID at check-in
- Be prepared to spend 4-6 hours to complete this course
- **Pass an 85-question final test**

NO STUDENT FIREARMS ARE PERMITTED IN THE CLASSROOM

- Students are responsible for bringing their own water and snacks.
- Students **MUST** wear hiking type shoes. **NO OPEN SHOES ARE PERMITTED**
- Students **MUST** be prepared to be outside in any weather for up to 3-hours.

Students **MUST** know the four rules of firearm safety:

- *ALWAYS point the muzzle of your gun in a safe direction.*
- *ALWAYS treat every gun as if it were loaded.*
- *ALWAYS keep your finger off the trigger until ready to fire.*
- *ALWAYS be sure of your target and beyond.*

The **classroom portion** of the course will cover the below listed proficiencies beginning with instructor lead demonstrations and student hands-on participation.

- How to P.R.O.V.E. (**Point, Remove, Observe, Verify, Examine**) a firearm
- The five action types: **lever, bolt, pump, semi, break-open/hinge**
- The six types of field carries: **two-handed, sling, elbow, cradle, trail, and shoulder**
- Be able to describe distinguishing characteristics of a whitetail buck and a mule deer buck

The **Field Course** is designed for students to demonstrate their proficiency with or ability to:

- Safely control a firearm's muzzle in field situations
- Safely navigate & cross obstacles in field situations
- Safely store, remove, and transport firearms in a vehicle
- **P.R.O.V.E.** a firearm
- Correctly identify Shoot and No Shoot situations
- Correctly identify and describe safe zones of fire

The course may include live-fire exercises in which students may shoot rifles, shotguns, or air rifles.

Once you have completed your online course, you may revisit it as often as you like to review specific areas.

If it has been more than a month since you took the online course, a review of the course material is HIGHLY recommended.
