<p>Page 5</p>	<p>Error – HDs 510, 520 and 700 are missing the quota language for the Sept 01 – 14 Archery Only Season.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sep 01 - Sep 14 - Either-sex Black Bear. Archery Only Season. 	<p>Correction – The Archery Only Season opportunities for HDs 510, 520 and 700 should read as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sep 01 - Sep 14 - Either-sex Black Bear. Archery only quota not more than 20% of Fall harvest subquota. Archery Only Season.
<p>Page 6</p>	<p>Error – The <i>Swan River Refuge Archery Only Hunting Area</i> is included in the “Restricted Area Descriptions”.</p>	<p>Correction – The <i>Swan River Refuge Archery Only Hunting Area</i> should not be included in the “Restricted Area Descriptions”.</p>
<p>Page 14</p>	<p>Error – Evidence Required of Game Animal’s Sex and Species printed as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It is unlawful to possess or transport the carcass of any big game animal unless evidence of the animal’s sex and species remains naturally attached to its carcass or a portion of the carcass. • Evidence of an animal’s sex and species must remain naturally attached until the carcass: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Is at the final place of storage; or - Is cut and wrapped in serving size; or - Is at a commercial meat processing facility; or - Is at a licensed taxidermist. • If the head or antlers are removed, evidence of sex in the form of testicles, penis, scrotum, udder or vulva must remain naturally attached. For example, boned out or quartered animals need evidence of sex naturally attached to a portion of the meat. 	<p>Correction – Evidence Required of Game Animal’s Sex and Species should read:</p> <p>For Black bears, evidence of sex must remain naturally attached to the hide. The following are considered lawful evidence of sex:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> --males; testicles or baculum --females; vulva.
