

## Central District Standard Daily and Possession Limits

*See map on page 51 to make sure you are in the Central District.* Each angler may take all of the limits listed in the chart, unless otherwise noted in the Central District Exceptions. For species not listed, there are no limits on the number of fish that may be taken or possessed.

Anglers who move from one fishing water to another may possess the limit of fish allowed only for the water on which they are currently fishing.

T R O U T	<b>Brook Trout</b>	20 daily and in possession.
	<b>Combined trout</b> includes Brown Trout, Rainbow Trout, Golden Trout, Cutthroat Trout and Arctic Grayling	<b>Lakes/Reservoirs:</b> 5 daily and 10 in possession, includes Cutthroat Trout.  <b>Rivers/Streams:</b> 5 daily and in possession, only 1 over 18 inches, only 1 can be a Cutthroat Trout. All Arctic Grayling must be released immediately.
	<b>Lake Trout</b>	3 daily and in possession.
<b>Bass</b>		5 daily and in possession.
<b>Burbot (Ling)</b>		5 daily and in possession.
<b>Channel Catfish</b>		10 daily and 20 in possession.
<b>Northern Pike</b>		10 daily and in possession.
<b>Pallid Sturgeon</b>		None - this is an endangered species and all fish must be released immediately. All waters are closed to fishing for Pallid Sturgeon.
<b>Salmon (Kokanee &amp; Chinook)</b>		10 daily and in possession.
<b>Sauger/Walleye</b>		5 daily and 10 in possession.
<b>Shovelnose Sturgeon</b>		5 daily and in possession, none over 40 inches.
<b>Tiger Muskie</b>		1 daily and in possession, must be over 40 inches.
<b>Whitefish</b>		20 daily and 40 in possession.
