



2020 MONTANA NONRESIDENT LANDOWNER SPONSORED DEER WORKSHEET

This worksheet is intended only to assist in gathering information to make your online application easier. Do **NOT** submit this by mail as it will be returned to you and you may miss the opportunity to apply online.

The online Landowner-Sponsored Deer Combination submission process will open on March 1, 2020, and will close at 11:45 P.M. (MST) on April 1, 2020.

You may take this completed worksheet to any Fish, Wildlife & Parks Regional office for assistance.

Once you have completed your online application, you will need to click on the appropriate link in your receipt and you will be directed to directions on submitting your Landowner Sponsored Certificate.

If you are successful in drawing a Landowner-Sponsored Deer Combination license, all deer hunting must be conducted on your Sponsor's land. This includes your General Deer license as well as any Deer B licenses you have. Hunters who draw a special permit to hunt mule deer bucks **MAY NOT** hunt mule deer bucks anywhere else in Montana.

Not all hunting districts require a permit to hunt a mule deer buck. **Please review the 2020 Deer, Elk, and Antelope Hunting Regulations for more information.**

If you have not already purchased your prerequisites, please add your 2020 Base Hunting License and your 2020 Conservation License to your cart.

- 6) **EMAIL ADDRESS:** You **must** provide a valid email address to receive your license information. You will **not** be contacted by any other means.
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- 7) **RESIDENCY STATUS:** For more information on residency requirements, please refer to MCA 87-2-102 Resident Defined. [LINK TO RESIDENCY DEFINITION](#)
- 8) **HUNTER EDUCATION NUMBER:** (MCA 87-2-105) A person who was born after January 1, 1985, must provide information verifying completion of a Hunter Education course in any state or province.
- 9) **MAILING LIST:** Do you want your name included on the lists that FWP provides to requestors? A requestor is anyone who wishes to purchase our mailing list. Even if you choose "no," under state law, FWP is required to allow those who wish to compile their own mailing list access to department records, including name, address, gender, residency, and whether you were successful.
- 10) **HUNTING DISTRICT CHOICES:** You will need to select your hunting district from the available districts listed in the 2020 Deer, Elk, and Antelope Hunting Regulations. This district number should be provided to you on the Landowner-Sponsored Certificate that you receive from your Sponsor.
- 11) **PARTY INSTRUCTIONS:** If you choose to apply as a party, all members in the party must be applying for Landowner-Sponsored Deer Combination licenses. Each party member must have a signed certificate from the Landowner.
- a. **Repeat these steps separately for your combination license and any special permits you apply for.**
 - b. The first individual who applies online will indicate that they are the first person applying when prompted.
 - i. They will need to enter the names of **ALL** prospective party members.
 - ii. They will be issued a "Party Number" upon completion of their transaction (the party number arrives via email as a PDF attachment). It is their responsibility to share this number with the other party participants.
 - iii. The next individual who applies will indicate that they are **NOT** the first to apply and will then enter the party number when prompted.
 - c. **ALL** party members must select the same Bonus Point option. This means, if the party leader selects "yes," to purchase a bonus point, all party members must select "yes" to purchase a bonus point. If the party leader selects "no," all party members must select "no." If you apply for different options, you will be removed from the party.



- d. If you are a Montana resident and apply in a party with nonresidents, your application will be treated as a nonresident for quota purposes (MCA 87-2-506).
