POSITION DESCRIPTION/SCOPE OF WORK: The successful recipient of this position will be responsible for assisting with conservation efforts for Westslope cutthroat trout and Arctic grayling in Southwest Montana. Responsibilities of this position will include electrofishing rescue efforts for entrained grayling, collection of eDNA samples in Westslope cutthroat project streams, using electrofishing for the survey and inventory of Westslope cutthroat conservation populations, assisting on non-native fish removals using mechanical and chemical removal, and assisting in annual electrofishing sampling in Arctic grayling spawning tributaries. Other responsibilities may include data entry and gear maintenance.

SKILLS, ABILITIES, KNOWLEDGE NEEDED (EDUCATION; UNDERGRAD/GRAD LEVEL, SUGGESTED/REQUIRED MAJORS):

Recipient must be currently enrolled or enrolled the previous Spring (2024) in a college university. A minimum GPA of 3.00 is required in a Natural Resources, Biology, Environmental Science, or similar major. Recipient must be able to complete strenuous work in remote locations with varying weather conditions. Hikes of upwards often miles carrying overnight backpacks and sampling gear will be required. The position requires extended camping trips; however, camping gear will be provided. Applicants should be skilled in map reading, navigation with GPS, operating an A TV, data collection, and communicating with the public. Experience in fisheries is a plus, but not required.
