Thank you to the Commission for accepting comment on proposed changes to the Madison River Recreation Plan.

I am particularly concerned with a proposal to repeal walk and wade rules on the upper Madison River, and restrotation rules.

I am under the understanding that the Commission plans to repeal those rules on the basis that there is no public support for walk and wade rules or rest-rotation rules.

Just a year ago, thousands of people commented on the Madison River Recreation Plan and in support of those very rules.

When I fish the Madison River it is almost always as a walk & wade angler. I do some floating but I think wading in the river and getting to know the river's structure in a small area is an enjoyable way to fish.

I will give credit to most commercial users, the guides and outfitters, for being reasonably courteous to wade anglers. It is, nonetheless, aggravating to look upstream and see dozens of boats, one after the other, working that shoreline water. It's pretty clear that if we wade anglers often are frustrated by poor angling success, there's a good chance that the fish are spooked away because a fleet of boats has already worked that same stretch of water.

If we look at the river and don't see many wade anglers, it is wrong to say that they don't exist. More likely, they have given up trying to find some quiet water to enjoy the solitude of the magnificent river and its environment.

The Madison River is a great asset for the people of Montana and for the people of the United States, in that much the shoreline is publicly accessible. For this reason, I would suggest that we need to manage the river so that people who choose not to hire a guide or can't afford to hire a guide can still find a stretch of river where they can find a degree of solitude and a chance to fool a trout without having to worry about being run over by a hundred or more boats in an afternoon of fishing.

It's good for the river. It's good for the fish. It's good for the angling public and their families who need a quality outdoor experience, whether they are local residents or visitors from around the United States or around the world.

SUBJECT: Consideration to repeal ARM 12.11.6702 and 12.11.6706 for Upper Madison River

I would like to submit the following comments to the proposed repeal of ARM 12.11.6702 and 12.11.6706. These ARMs pertain to walk and wade from Raynolds FA to Lyons Bridge and rest and rotation on the upper Madison River.

I am not in favor of repeal of ARM 12.11.6702 and ARM 12.11.6706. I support keeping and implementing these ARMs. In addition, I have additional comments/opinions on each of these ARMs.

In general, I am not in favor of more fishing opportunities on the upper Madison and believe (and have observed) that there has been a significant increase in people fishing the upper Madison, from both boats and wading along the riverbanks. I have lived in Montana since the 1970s. In 2000 through 2021, I have seen a significant increase in population that has resulted in more pressure on the Montana fishery and a diminished outdoor fishing experience. In the case of the upper Madison, given the increase in the numbers of people fishing and the obvious pressure on the fishery, it makes sense to have "walk and wade" sections and "rest and rotation" zones. I am in favor of giving the fishery "a break" from what has become, the relentless presentation of lures and fly patterns (that are pulled past their noses) and the stress from catch and release and the stress from large shadows of the boats passing over the fish. These two ARMs, while not perfect, would add to the foundations to create a more resilient fishery in the face of a warming climate and more frequent fishing closures, each summer.

Also, what about all the animals that rely on fish for their diet, such as otters, Kingfishers, Osprey, and other raptors? What about nesting birds along the river corridor and other animals with their young in Spring and Summer? The constant presence of boats and people fishing from the bank is likely disruptive to these animals nesting, rearing young, and depending fish or river nutrients to survive.

I am not a fisheries biologist but someone who has fished all my life. In consideration of the increasing numbers of fishing enthusiasts fishing the

upper Madison, it makes sense to me to give sections of the river a break during Spring, Summer, and Fall. Winter is relatively more hostile on the upper Madison and hence less of an impact on the fishery due to fewer people fishing, although this could change due to our warming climate forecast.

Hence, I am in favor of keeping ARM 12.11.6702 and 12.11.6706. Please do not repeal ARM 12.11.6702 and 12.11.6706.

In regard to ARM 12.11.6702, I would advocate for a modification to this ARM in that there would be no fishing from a boat on Saturdays and Sundays or any day because it preserves a high quality, walk and wade experience. The Madison River is relatively narrow in the reach of Raynolds FA to Lyons Bridge. Thus, in this section, having people fishing from boats pass by people bank fishing is a diminishment of the outdoor fishing experience for both parties.

In regard to ARM 12.11.6706, I would advocate for a modification to this ARM in that there would be resting sections of the upper Madison River to all forms of fishing, to include both guided (commercial or contracted) and private (not contracted) fishing from a boat and from the bank. It is unfair to single out commercial guides/trips and allow people to bank fish in these proposed rest sections. Make it a genuine rest for the fish and other animals in that section of river. My observations indicate that, every year, there are increasing numbers of people who bank fish (walk and wade). And, because of their increasing numbers, there is an ever-increasing potential for impacts to the fishery, other wildlife, and the river corridor.

With regard to the proposed sections to rest and rotate, the following considerations should be made: Establish sections where boats can have a reasonable length of floating, for a quality experience, with reasonable put-in and take-out access. Establish sections based on protection of the more sensitive aspects of the fishery and wildlife resources.

Finally, I am in favor of either a self-reporting system or having personnel in the field (river ambassadors) during Spring, Summer, and Fall who can collect information on the numbers of people fishing, location, fishing by boat or along the bank, reporting their catch and fish size and variety, and report on any other aspects of their fishing experience. Make it easy for people to self-report with an "app". This information will assist in future decisions regarding the upper Madison River.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposed action.

Comments: I have serious concerns about the hearing scheduled on 12-15-21 regarding ARM 12.11.6702 and 12.11.6708.. Each of the rules "will be implemented as a trial program on 1-1-22 unless adjusted by the work group". "The Fish and Wildlife Commission will review" each rule in 2023. If these rules are repealed the intent of the rules would be circumvented before they are even implemented. I wish to express my very strong opposition to the repeal of the ARM 12.11.6702 AND 12.11.6706.

I find serious misrepresentations being made that there is no support for these rules and frankly feel both the process of public involvement and management of the resource by FWP are not in line with the state constitution. All actions by the alleged Madison River Advisory Panel, the FWP Commission, and the FWP in this and other Montana wildlife and resource issues blatantly support the commercialization of citizen owned resources and wildlife over the interest of the general public. I have spoken to an overwhelming number of folks who support the rules and statements to the contrary are clear falsehoods. Falsehoods that need to be presented for what they are in a court of law.

The conversion of the Madison watershed from a public fishery to an exclusive business of the outfitting community is but one recent example of the misuse of public property with FWP support. We have allowed the fox to watch the hen house by giving outfitters the oversight authority of their industry — shocking in light of the fact that we recently had to rescind the authority of "youth programs" in the state to oversee themselves after the abuses that came into public view in that industry.

Please accept these comments on behalf of the George Grant Chapter of Trout Unlimited, headquartered in Butte, Montana, a short 80-minute drive to the upper Madison River. Our organization represents over 1,000 conservation-minded members and supporters throughout southwest Montana. Our members are angry that the Montana Fish and Wildlife Commission is proposing to repeal central elements of the Madison River Recreation Plan.

Specifically, we are opposed to the repeal of ARM 12-11-6702 (Walk Wade Sections of the Madison River) and 12-11-6706 (Rest/Rotation of Madison River Commercial Use). Our organization, and the members we represent, strongly support both the Walk-Wade and Rest-Rotation rules on the Madison River. The Commission's statement of rational for their proposed repeal is "lack of support" for either rule. This claim is a farce. These two rules are an organic testament of public support, rooted in two petitions filed by rank-and-file sportsmen to **compel** the commission to adopt these two rules. There is no more organic demonstration of support than the grassroots process that led to the Commission's adoption of these two rules in late 2020. The Commission's claim of no public support is simply false.

During 2019 and 2020, the Fish and Wildlife Commission conducted the most exhaustive analysis of public sentiment in FWP history. In addition to two public comment processes and a rulemaking process, FWP also conducted a Madison River survey in which over 7,500 people participated. This survey revealed that over 60% of respondents (over 4,500 people) stated support for the Walk-Wade and Rest-Rotation proposals on the Madison River; a statement of overwhelming support for the management action later codified as 12-11-6702 and 12-11-6706. What other FWP proposals have ever enjoyed the popular support of over 4,500 respondents? This is the most profound demonstration of public support possible. Given this overwhelming demonstration of public support, how can the Fish and Wildlife Commission seriously claim there is no popular support for the Walk-Wade and Rest-Rotation?

Likewise, during the rulemaking public comment period in October 2020 that ultimately led to the final adoption of 12-11-6702 and 12-11-6706, the public again demonstrated OVERWHELMING public support for both rules. The new members of the Fish and Wildlife Commission proposing this repeal need to only review the survey and comment records from the 2020 Madison River process to fully appreciate the overwhelming public support for the Walk-Wade and Rest-Rotation rules on the Madison River.

The Commission's proposed repeal of 12-11-6702 and 12-11-6706 is grounded in a false premise. Finalizing the proposed repeal would be a public disservice. Contrary to the Commission's claims, both rules enjoy overwhelming public support. The Commission has an obligation to withdraw the proposed repeal of 12-11-6702 and 12-11-6706.
