 - 3. The department proposes to repeal the following rule:

12.9.102 BLACK BEAR POLICY

AUTH: 87-1-301, MCA

IMP: 87-1-201, 87-1-301, MCA

<u>REASON</u>: Repeal of this rule does not change the current management of black bears in any way nor the enforcement of rules for black bear harvest and field handling.

ARM 12.9.102 was adopted in 1972 and has not been updated since. However, statutes pertaining to black bear management have changed in the interim and supersede the language of this rule. Specifically, while this rule states that black bears are trophy animals and that only the head and hide need to be removed from the field, black bears are presently classified as game animals pursuant to 87-

- 6-101, MCA, and edible portions of bear meat may not be wasted. In addition, the commission's management of black bears and the department's processes regarding bear conflict management have evolved since this rule was passed in 1972. The rule is outdated and contradicts statute and current management practices.
- 4. Concerned persons may submit their data, views, or arguments orally at the telephonic hearing. Written data, views, or arguments may also be submitted to: Wildlife Division, Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks, P.O. - 5. Jessica Snyder or another hearing officer appointed by the department has been designated to preside over and conduct the hearing.
- 6. The department maintains a list of interested persons who wish to receive notice of rulemaking actions proposed by the department or commission. Persons who wish to have their name added to the list shall make a written request that includes the name and mailing address of the person to receive the notice and specifies the subject or subjects about which the person wishes to receive notice.
