Amendment to 2022 Mountain Lion Quotas and Special Licenses Submitted by Commissioner Byorth at request of FWP

I move that the 2022 mountain lion season quota master list proposed by the department be amended to increase the lion quota from 6 to 8 mountain lions in LMU 339.

1. Describe the proposed season/quotas changes and provide a summary of prior history (i.e., prior history of permits, season types, etc.).

The total quota for LMU 339 (formerly LMU 339/343/388) was unintentionally reduced during the spring 2022 season-setting process from 8 to 6. This proposed change would restore the total quota to 8, as it had been since the 2014 season, retain a female sub-quota of 2 (as proposed spring 2022) and retain 1 special/limited lion license (as proposed spring 2022).

2. Why is the proposed change necessary?

This is necessary to maintain the quota as it was intended to be for the upcoming season.

3. What is the current population's status in relation to the management objectives? (i.e., state management objectives from management plan if applicable; provide current and prior years of population survey, harvest, or other pertinent information).

Mountain lions are well established in LMU 339. Within this past year and in other recent years, lions were within the City of Helena and in suburban and exurban areas surrounding the City. Additionally, lions were removed from this LMU by Wildlife Services on a recurring basis. Access is more difficult compared to surrounding LMUs: requiring snowshoeing in some areas and permission limited in others. Hence, since 2014 the LMU frequently remained open for the season length (Table 1; Figure 1). Given conflicts, the quota might otherwise be increased.

4. Provide information related to any weather/habitat factors that have relevance to this change (i.e., habitat security, hunter access, vegetation surveys, weather index, snow conditions, temperature/precipitation information).

Road access is limited, and hunters may need to snowshoe to successfully pursue lions.
