State wide, "other than special bull permit units", for hunters 18 and under offer any elk, just like youth hunters get and do the same for hunters over 60, hunters over 60 and hunters 18 and under aren't the primary elk harvester in Montana. This would encourage more people to buy tags and would peak new or younger people's interest in hunting and keep some of the older sportsman in the field.

Require mule deer hunters to choose their region for an antlered buck mule deer, or put in for a guaranteed mule deer tag, that is valid for up to 3 hunting districts or 2 regions within the state, at least that will reduce the statewide free for all when it comes to shooting a mule deer buck anywhere a person happens to want to hunt. I am commenting on the proposed boundary changes and new elk hunting districts for 322, 323 and 324. I am the former FWP biologist for this area. Making these changes presumes a degree of population management that is not realistic and is a step backwards in effective management. The change to one district, 322, was made only a few years ago and should have been made a couple decades ago but decision makers were more interested in maintaining the facade of effective micro-management. The justification for these changes is to align the hunting district with known elk distribution. It is known from FWP's own distribution data through telemetry studies that elk intermingle across the entire existing HD 322 and even across the state line with Idaho, despite that primary distribution is on a somewhat smaller scale. What's more is that micromanaging by re-implementing small HD's removes the beneficial potential to harvest antlerless elk where they are most available during the hunting season. After a couple decades of an elk population beyond objective and no progress toward reducing it to a more productive (i.e., higher calf/cow ratio) level with fewer unproductive old cows, going back to an approach of micromanaging will only make circumstances worse. It was a joke over ten years ago when decision makers decided that the approach to a population over objective should be to simply raise the objective. This proposal is a step in the same direction.

For heaven's sake, when the current season structure is BTB or antlerless season long, antlerless B licenses on private land only and the population is above objective, why on earth reinstitute micromanagement? Leave it the way it was already! There can be no legitimate reason to think one needs to micromanage antlerless harvest under this scenario of season regulation and population status. There is certainly no need to be paranoid about overharvesting. Leave the door open for hunters to go where elk are available when the opportunity presents. Furthermore, raise Elk B licenses to improve the potential for adequate harvest!

I would like to voice my opposition to the proposed elk shoulder hunt east of HWY 89 in unit 413. The population figures in this unit do not take into consideration a shift in herd migration patterns, beginning around primarily 2017, from properties around and including the Judith Game Range to the Otter Creek area. Increases in archery hunting pressure and OHV traffic in the Little Belts and especially the Northeast (Dry Fork & Dry Wolf) section of the Little Belts have shifted elk away from traditional migration routes resulting in a redistribution of elk into other areas. Without evidence from a collared elk study, it would be premature to recommend a shoulder hunt that could have significant effects on herd dynamics for units 413, 420, and 448. Greater efforts to keep elk on accessible public lands by limiting archery hunting pressure, working with USFS to create and enforce seasonal closures on OHV trails during the fall, and follow through with approved yet unrealized prescribed burns in the NE Little Belts are all mitigating measures that FWP should take prior to considering a shoulder hunt. Elk in the Little Belts are increasingly getting pushed out of National Forest Lands earlier in the fall and until steps are taken to address those factors affecting herd migration, a shoulder hunt, with no identified measure beyond an ambiguous reduction in landowner complaints (how many complaints are or aren't acceptable?), could have drastic effects on a herd that just a few years ago was below objective.

1. In many of the justifications the answer to "how will the success of this proposal be measured" is spring survey's and hunter surveys. Spring flight survey's are highly dependent on spring weather conditions and it is possible to have some years where valuable data is not collected. Similarly, calls where hunter surveys are conducted do not reflect the most accurate data for a region or unit in terms of harvest. I would like to strongly advocate that we implement mandatory reporting for harvested big game animals during the hunting season. This would more accurately reflect what is being harvested in an area, and help FWP to make more accurate management decisions based and review current management practices to better examine if they are having the intended results.

2. 281-01 is a proposed cow elk tag (10 in total). Based on the state of the elk report unit 281 is below objective according to the 2022 count at 463 elk. Why would we be issuing cow tags for a unit that is under objective? I assume hunters that live in and around that area have expressed a desire to have cow elk tags for that unit. I strongly encourage FWP to make management decisions based on scientific data and not on subjective feelings. If this unit is under objective, please do not grant any cow elk tags, allow the elk to recruit greater numbers, at which point a cow elk tag could be considered when there is a more stable population count.

I feel there were a couple changes from the last season setting process that have done more harm than good and I would like to see them changed.

The first is the requirement that an elk permit locks the hunter into only that unit. At first, this sounded like a good idea, but after experiencing it myself, I think it has backfired. What's happened is the quotas for many of the limited entry archery permits are very liberal and these units are primarily private land. That's causing all the permit holders to overcrowd the public and have no choice to go elsewhere. There is now more pressure on public and more animals that are spending time on private due to this. If hunters had the option to pull out of the unit and go to a general area, rather than hunt with the pressure we'd have a much better solution.

If this can't be changed, there are a couple units that I feel have way too liberal of quotas and that's unit 447 and the 426/417 archery permits. In 447, the quota is 400 and there are only a few access points, so potentially you could have over 100 folks sharing the same access point. I'd love to see that quota cut in half. There are 300 archery only permits allocated for the 426/417 units. 426 is nearly all private and 417 has major elk distribution issues. The public holds very little elk, so if the quota was reduced to 150-200, it'd make for a much more worthwhile hunt.

As for the mule deer proposals, I agree with the proposal to make units 426, 417, and 410 permit only the last two weeks. I've hunted these areas and seen firsthand how the hunting has been on a downward trend and glad to see something's being implemented.

Last, I'm not in favor of opening units 339 and 343 to cow and spike hunting on a general tag the last two weeks of the season. First, 339 is a coveted permit that takes years to draw and if I had it, I'd hate to have to compete with a bunch of general season tagholders the last couple weeks. Second, I've hunted these areas quite a bit as I live in Helena and I can tell you, most hunters are not dealing with an overabundance of elk, so I don't see a need to try and lower the population. Instead of trying to get the population down to the 2005 elk management plan number, I'd rather wait and see what the objective is in the new plan and go from there.

I oppose a late season CWD Managment hunt in Region 6 for mule deer. My reasons for opposing the season date changes are listed below-

- 1. CWD is more prevalent state-wide (and nation-wide) in White-tailed deer and this hunt is aimed solely at Mule Deer. Which, as a species, is dwindling in numbers across the country and I have no desire to see them decimated in our state in the name of saving the herd as this has not been an effective strategy for controlling the disease.
- 2. The season dates for this hunt directly conflict with Montanas current Heritage Muzzleloader Season Dates and I would like to see those who choose to practice the discipline of muzzleloader hunting have their fair chance at harvesting a deer without being in direct competition with 500 other hunters who have the clear advantage of center-fire rifles and magnified optics
- 3. I believe it is beyond fair-chase to pursue these animals on their winter range and in an area critical to their survival. I learned this when I was supplied the book Beyond Fair Chase: The Ethic and Tradition of Hunting by Jim Posewitz when I completed Hunters Education (A prerequisite for obtaining a hunting license in Montana)
- 4. The hunt area that is proposed for these season dates has a herd of migratory deer that is crossing an international border once in the winter, and again in the spring. This poses a conflict with our Canadian neighbors to the north in Saskatchewan who need to be involved in the process, and decision, of controlling CWD.
- 5. The area these herds are using to winter is on public land and if they are pushed off of public land by hunting pressure during the proposed season dates they will end up in winter feed stocks of private land owners and cause conflicts.

Before I delve into my specific comments about the proposed Region 6 CWD Management Zone, I want to offer a broader comment on mule deer management. As has been voiced at many public meetings in eastern Montana - and most recently at the Nov. 1 Glasgow season-setting session - there is deep interest in revisiting Montana's mule deer hunting season structures. I hope this topic will become a high priority for FWP over this next biennium and look forward to discussions about various options and alternatives to the status quo.

This comment is specific to the proposed establishment of two CWD Management Zones in Region 6: I am generally supportive of the proposal. The high prevalence of CWD north of Highway 2, and the disappointing inaction of our Saskatchewan neighbors to reduce prevalence north of the border both require that we do something to slow the spread of Chronic Wasting Disease to the south. Without fairly aggressive management, CWD could easily become endemic in the Missouri Breaks within a few years. While I do not pretend that this management will stop the spread of CWD, it's a targeted and measured response to the situation. Doing nothing would be the wildlife-management equivalent of malpractice.

I do have a couple suggestions for this proposal, which is fairly controversial in the Region 6 hunting community. First, I request that FWP require successful hunters in this management season to submit their harvested animals for CWD testing. By having additional samples, the department can more precisely measure prevalence and distribution of CWD. Plus, mandatory testing assures hunters that the department is actively managing for CWD and not simply interested in killing more deer.

Second, I recommend that FWP and the Office of Montana Governor initiate high-level discussions with counterparts in Saskatchewan with the goal to create a CWD management buffer on the north side of the international border. Without some sort of intervention, Montana will not be able to effectively manage CWD.

Lastly, I want to applaud FWP and the Region 6 wildlife staff for eliminating the elk shoulder seasons in the region and for increasing the population objective in the Missouri Breaks elk management districts.

I'm writing in regards to the proposals for Mule deer and whitetails in Region 6. I've read the proposals and disagree with much of what is stated.

I've hunted Region 6 for over 40 years... More specifically, districts 600 and 690. I bowhunt as well as bird hunt and rifle hunt. I also do a lot of wildlife photography. From Sept. through Dec. I'm out and about nearly every day (I'm retired). The FWP estimate of the Mule Deer Population being 46% above average in 600 is absolutely ridiculous! Last winter totally decimated the population (mule deer, whitetails, and antelope) in 600. Places where I would normally see 25 or 30 whitetails out feeding in the evening I now see 4 or 5 and in many places none at all. I recently drove from Chinook to the Saskatchewan border around daybreak. I never saw a deer... not one!

The proposal calls for 500-1500 Mule Deer Antlerless tags for next year in 600.. There should be no antlerless tags issued. None! The justification page states that 291 mule deer were observed during an aerial survey in the spring of 2023 and. I challenge anyone from FWP to show me 291 mule deer in 600. It appears that the goal of FWP is to totally wipe out the deer population in Region 6, and districts 600 and 640 in particular.

Regarding whitetails, there should be no antlerless tags issued at all until the population recovers from the severe winter last year and EHD. The justification states that whitetail populations are between 40 and 51 percent below the long term average across region 6, yet FWP wants to allow 3 over the counter antlerless tags? I'm beyond baffled with that proposal. Makes no sense whatsoever Also, to "Manage" (if you can call it that) a population over an entire region makes no sense. What might be happening in the Havre/Chinook area can be very different from what is happening in the Plentywood/Scobey are, for example. Why have districts if they are not going to be used to manage the deer properly? Region 6 is huge, as are all the Regions... I'm guessing it's probably the size of all of the New England states combines, yet the whole region is managed the same from one end to the other for whitetails? The proposal states that hunters have the ability to move around the region to where the deer are at. Really? I know of no one around here who would drive to Plentywood to shoot a couple of does.. We hunt where we live!!

A good measure of the state of affairs around 600 is to look at the number of hunters. In years past we were invaded by out of state hunters, hunters from western Montana, etc. This year you would be hard pressed to find anyone from out of the area hunting... There is one here and there, but nothing compared to past years. The word is out that there are very, very few deer in 600. Yes, there are a fair number of deer along the Milk River, but access is nearly impossible. Ranchers bring in their cattle from their summer pasture and the valley fills up with cows about the time hunting season starts. Get a mile or two (north or south) of the Milk River Valley and you'll find little of nothing..

I suspect the FWP will do as they dam well please regardless of the input from hunters and landowners... that's been my experience in the past. They hold public meetings to try to justify what they've already decided. I used to go to these meetings, but quit going... It's just too frustrating.

Dear Montana Fish, Wildlife, & Parks:

On behalf of the Montana Chapter of Backcountry Hunters & Anglers (MT BHA), please see the comments below regarding the proposed 2024/25 statewide season-setting regulations.

First, we appreciate the ongoing efforts of the Department to provide opportunities for public engagement with these efforts. Citizens must have a say in these matters, and while we generally have confidence in FWP's field staff and think their opinions matter, they shouldn't be the be-all and end-all when it comes to decisions on wildlife held in the public trust. The current season-setting process could be further improved by creating better opportunities to solicit and include ideas from citizens.

While many of our members will submit comments on their own focusing on regional proposals, we have a few suggestions related mostly to the statewide season proposals.

The Montana Chapter supports mandatory submissions in CWD management areas, and we flagged this during scoping. CWD is one of the biggest threats to the health of our wildlife and hunting opportunities, and any and all efforts to curb the spread are greatly appreciated. Surveillance is key, which is why we support the proposed mandatory testing requirement in Region 1 CWD management areas and request that this requirement be expanded to the Region 6 CWD Management Zones as well.

Additionally, we encourage the department to take the necessary steps to require mandatory harvest reporting statewide across all reported species. It's way overdue. This would provide far more accurate data for not only pressing issues like CWD, but also broader concerns like wildlife (and hunter) distribution, harvest rates, age class, and success rates by weapon/season, among other things. We flagged this in our scoping comments, and are disappointed that mandatory reporting is not included in the final proposals.

Many proposals related to deer-hunter crowding discussed during scoping did not make it to the final proposals. We remain neutral on the deer-hunter crowding proposals discussed during scoping, and we recognize the real and growing concern that is hunter crowding. We encourage the Department to not only require mandatory reporting but to launch a statewide mule-deer management plan to help outline specific management objectives and address hunter distribution and crowding issues.

We support and appreciate the clear definition of 'first and only choice.' However, the definition states that "licenses and/or permits issued through a drawing identified as a "first and only choice" opportunity will not be offered as a surplus license/permit opportunity if the department receives fewer applications than the number of licenses/permits available". We request that in this scenario the 90/10 resident/nonresident allocation split still be followed.

The proposal to 'eliminate quota ranges for all elk permit license-permit types' is concerning (for deer too) and could lead to drastic increases (or reductions) in limited-entry permit districts. We ask that the quota ranges for both deer and elk permit license-permit types be kept in place to provide sideboards for Commission actions.

In all areas/HDs with unlimited OTC elk B and deer B/antelope B permits, we ask that these be permitted/capped instead. Issuing unlimited B tags is leading to both hunter-crowding and game-distribution issues. Additionally, by capping/permitting all B tags/permits will help track use/pressure and automatically implement the 90/10 split with residents/non-residents, which is an important step to get a handle on non-resident hunting pressure.

We ask that all late/early season elk B tags (formerly known as shoulder season tags) are valid on private lands only; many existing and proposed late/early season opportunities include BLM and state lands, but exclude USFS lands only. We recommend making these private-land only to better manage elk distribution and to honor the original intent of shoulder seasons. Additionally, we ask that

late/early season elk B tags are only considered in HDs found to be above management objectives according to the new EMP.

HD 309 is the Gallatin Valley Weapons Restriction Area. The proposal to make a weapons-restriction exclusion zone for private landowners owning 160 acres or more is something we can support. However we ask that the general weapon season dates be followed for archery-only and that the exclusion zone only applies to antlerless deer/elk. In other words, we support a change that will allow rifle harvests on larger properties that align with the general rifle season (including antlered harvests during the general rifle season) and/or with shoulder seasons (antlerless only), but only approved archery-only equipment should be allowed for antlered animals during the archery-only season dates.

Finally, we appreciate the unique and quality opportunity offered with the 313-45 permit and support keeping this a limited-entry area (50 permits) valid during the last two weeks of the general rifle season.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposed hunting regulations. First, I highly recommend a statewide mandatory harvest report on all species. This is far overdue and would vastly improve the information provided to assist FWP in making sound management decisions in the future. Secondly, I recommend the department to develop a statewide mule-deer management plan with specific objectives to increase mule deer buck numbers across the state and reduce hunter over-crowding. I would also be in favor of eliminating mule deer buck hunting for a year or two in certain districts in order to increase buck numbers. Dear Friends- thanks for the opportunity to provide these comments on the proposed hunting regulation changes for deer and elk. I appreciate the effort FWP has taken to involve the public in the process. I also commend your FWP wardens. I had a really nice visit with your warden up in HD540 recently—he's a great representative of the Department. Following are my comments:

Generally:

- I support the proposed changes overall to: 1) better deal with CWD, although I urge the Commission to consider SOON mandatory reporting. I understand this will require higher levels of staffing at current CWD check stations but we need to stay on top of this, and 2) changes regarding mule deer (IE- moving to antlered buck only harvest) in order to favor (re) building the mule deer populations. We need to get a handle on the mule deer decline and what we've done so far isn't enough.
- I'd also like to see FWP move towards mandatory harvest reporting. This could be made easier with the new app, but I really feel that it's not an inconvenience and will get you more accurate harvest data as well as a better understanding of where hunters are going that would help you figure out future license allocation in order to reduce crowding in some places. It could be something as simple as sending a text.

Specifically:

- I hunt in regions 5 and 3. The proposed changes for region 5 all revolve around mule deer and I'm supportive of those, see above. Regarding region 3, I support the idea of combining the 314 cow tag into the 397 multi-HD OTC license. However, I request that you add HD 317 to the 397 license. The populations seem to be at a similar level of health and size and they have been managed similarly, with a B tag draw. Clearly, the department is aiming to being down elk numbers in both places. The only difference is access, where 317 is slightly more favorable but not much. Why not add 317 to the 397 license and do away w the 317 tag? It would provide hunters more flexibility within the same 'neighborhood' and would similarly better target cows to help FWP bring herd numbers back within objective.

That's about it. Thanks for the chance to comment.

Mule deer management is in need of a different approach across the state. Montana is growing in population, nonresident hunting pressure has markedly increased and public lands are increasingly pressured. Mule deer numbers are in a steep decline in many areas and mature bucks are increasingly rare. We cannot manage the same as we did ten or twenty years ago and need a plan for the future.

Solutions to these problems exist, although it will take a statewide effort to have meaningful impact. I applaud the efforts of Region 4 to limit deer harvest and reduce hunter pressure in the Breaks units, however, this will result in a redistribution of hunter pressure to other areas that cannot sustain added pressure. The solution is to both limit or reduce public land hunting pressure on a STATEWIDE scale. This can be accomplished in several ways: 1) make mule deer buck harvest available ONLY on a Regional Permit or on a HD specific permit. 2) Limit doe licenses to one per hunter (White-tailed or mule deer), 3) make mule deer doe hunting available to residents and/or youth only, 4) limit the hunting season to a two or three week period that does not go beyond November 10 to protect rutting bucks and improve age class.

The proposal to allow for either-sex mule deer in Region 6 CWD Zone using a B tag is unsettling. In other areas of the state where this has been used, populations have not recovered. Northern Region 6 is one of the last best places for mule deer in Montana. Reducing the buck population in this area will essentially wipe out the last of what we have left to hunt. Either proceed conservatively with the quota limit or do not issue those B tags. Thanks for considering.

Please consider allowing HD 360 OTC Elk B tags to be valid on National Forest Service lands. If curbing elk herd numbers in the Madison Valley is the true rational for switching to OTC B tags, then allowing harvest on NFS lands will indeed help with that mission. At the time of writing this response (November 13, 2023), very few elk have made their way to agricultural lands due to the mild start of the winter. Elk can only be harvested where they are – and right now they are largely in the high/back country. Many hunters have a difficult time securing hunting access to private, non NFS lands. There are some valley floor state lands available for hunting, but as mentioned above, the elk do not always make it to those lands when mild weather coincides with the general rifle hunt. I also worry about overcrowding and safety issues on the limited state lands when the elk do come out (like they did last year). I know for a fact that many of the hunters I run into on the NFS lands take advantage of the Elk B tags and have steady success on those hunts. I am commenting on proposed changes to elk and deer regulations in HD 130. I am highly supportive of eliminating the either sex whitetail deer harvest opportunity during the first week of the general season and change to a 5-week buck only regulation in HD 130. The deer population is at or near an all-time low in my lifetime in the upper Swan Valley of HD 130 (I have been hunting whitetail deer in HD 130 since 1994). The Swan is experiencing low recruitment levels and I do not see the population rebounding despite recent milder winters. There are a variety of reasons for decreased whitetail deer populations over time such as highway mortality, habitat considerations (winter/summer range conditions, reed canarygrass invasion of many wetlands, many noxious weed infestations across the landscape), diverse predator populations, climate change resulting in more rain events mid-winter that result in hard snow crust events, liberal FWP regulations regarding doe harvests when the population data doesn't support those, etc. Eliminating the either sex harvest opportunity in the first week of the season will help increase recruitment and population size (as the data clearly shows in FWP's population trend graph when the regulations are buck-only). I also support removing the either sex opportunity on the general license for people holding a PTHFV in order to maintain/increase elk populations in HD 130 and provide more structure on accounting for how many cows are removed each season, rather than leaving it open-ended. I'd like to make comments on the deer/elk hunting proposals.

1) PTHFV

I see the Commision is proposing to eliminate PHTFV in HDs 120 and 130. The reasoning given is to grow more elk, which is fine. The Department needs to be able to gather correct data on the other areas where PTHFV are granted. How many more antlerless elk are harvested with the PTHFV above the 25 "B" licenses that are in the drawing? The Department has no idea. Following the 96-96 winter, elk hunting in Region 1 was basically changed from "cows only the first week", then Bulls the remainder of the season, to antlered bulls the whole season and cows ONLY by permit. The reasoning was to grow more elk following that particular winter. At first there were 100 cow permits and gradually was reduced down to 25 "B" permits now, where a successful hunter can harvest 2 elk in the same HD. THAT doesn't make any sense either if you're concerned about growing elk. Maybe mandatory reporting for the PTHFV so the Department has a better grasp of what and how many are being harvested from the steering wheel of a truck. We require mandatory reporting for wolves, lions, bears, and now the Department is proposing mandatory reporting for Libby's CWD Unit. Why not PTHFV?

2) Game Cameras

Why is the department allowing game cameras in the field throughout hunting seasons? If someone flys in a airplane over his hunting area, he is not allowed to hunt that area for 24 hours. Now, with the game cameras in the field for the entirety of the season, Joe can sit at his computer at home and monitor his cameras and when a shooter bull shows up, he just calls Johnny and says, "hey, we got a keeper on camera 3, lets roll!" Or, a hunter can walk up to his camera, plug it into his phone and see if an elk has just passed by or how long ago it was. Game cameras need to go back to when they were not allowed after opening of archery season. We put up 6-8 cameras every year and I can tell you it is definitely an advantage to know if elk or deer are using that area.

3.) Enhanced Hunting Access

The premise of the EHAs was to put a carrot in front of property owners who historically did not allow public hunting on their property. They would receive 2 either sex tags, some monetary allowances, and they would allow public hunters, chosen by the Department to hunt on their property. Makes sense, right?

But what happened with the Wolf Prairie Ranch in HD 103 was totally the opposite. The Commission granted an application to Southern Pines Plantation (SPP) where SPP pulled OUT 14,400 acres that was already in BMA, Type 1, and locked the general public out, hunters who have hunted that area even back when the land belonged to ST Regis Paper Company and Plum Creek. The land owner has put up 13 gates and has signs every where warning people to stay out. Remember this was property that wasn't being allowed to be hunted. It was ALREADY in a BMA!

Going forward, I would hope the Commission would deny this application when it is presented in 2024 and any other application where normal BMAs are partitioned off to allow out of state landowners the luxury of being given 2 either sex elk permits.

I would like to comment t on the proposal about 199-20 CWD tag. This draw tag should follow the same draw rules as all other draw tags. These tags have yet to sell out at the first stage of the draw, then they go to surplus were they should be limited to 1 or 2 tags, then if any are left they go over the counter. According to the regulations a hunter can have up to 7 B tags in the state. If someone wants to go hunt bucks then more power to them. I had multiple tags last year up here. I filled my first tag on a doe because I had extra tags, my second tag was filled on a buck who tested positive for CWD aged around 4 1/2 year old. If I only had 1 tag and filled it with my doe, that buck could of easily made it through the season and spread CWD more. I highly doubt that most 199-20 holders are filling 7 tags with bucks. Average tags filled across the state is around the 18-20 % rate of sucess. The current rate of 199-20 tags are right around that. The proposal states they want more samples but want to limit tags available to hunters like me that have a higher rate of sucess. I like the mandatory reporting and think that this is a good idea. We have a road hunter problem up here. The easy solution to those complaing about hunters like me is for them to enter the draw to begine with-problem solved all drawn would have 1 tag, and for those times that not all tags get sold in the draw then they should follow the process of all other draws so those that want extra tags can get them and do thier best to fill them. I would think that reducing the draw to a hunter only getting one tag would produce less samples because hunters might hold out for a buck and be willing to eat tag soup because they can fill thier A tag. If people have problems with the system then they should propose a system change for all draw areas not just 199-20 CWD management zone, but they don't want to change to rules across the state like that because it's not a good way to manage deer across the state! I hope you leave the CWD tags alone and let those that want and can to harvest ther deer according to current draw system rules. Having one draw tag follow different rules then other draw areas is confusing! Leave the 199-20 tag the way it is and require mandatoring reporting.

These comments pertain to 339/343. Hunting of cows in this area has swung from one extreme to the other over the last decade or so. At one point cows were legal on a general tag, then swung all the way to a permit where a taking a cow meant punching your general tag. I think a good balance has been the current B tag and would oppose opening it up to a general license. Many of the herds in this area seem to be smaller and I have concerns about the use of general tags again. We saw at least one "shoot out" situation in the open sage outside of Silver City when that regulation was previously allowed. Lots of roads and lots of hunters.

I'm wondering why increasing the number of cow licenses isn't being proposed as the means to increase harvest. The 2022 stats say the cow license was a 75% draw. In 2023, I know of two hunters who applied for the cow B license and did not draw. These are guys that hit it hard and would likely have been successful. I'm not doubting that landowners may be seeing impacts from increasing elk numbers. If we have to go the route of general tag cow hunting, at least keep it to private only and work with landowners on damage hunts. While the districts include a lot of private BMA, other parts of the district are public land.

I do not believe that the proposed change would accomplish the stated goal due to the fact that elk in that area are quite transient and frequently traffic north of the hydrological divide. Further, the proposed change creates an enforcement issue due to the remoteness of the hydrological divide. I have hunted every year since I graduated hunters safety at the age of 12. In the last three years I have noticed a drastic decline in deer numbers in 670, southern 630, 650 and 640. Ever the river bottoms in eastern 630 between Nashua and Fort Peck have taken a hit. The hunting pressure that I observe is very high, each year I see more out of state vehicles and less of locals. I believe that the abundance of hunters has pressured the deer that remain in these areas into larger more confined herds. This in turn allows disease to spread faster which results in more sickly and dying deer in a shorter time frame. I believe the first step in controlling diseases in the deer population and regaining the deer numbers is less hunting pressure. Thank you for the opportunity to provide comment on the 2024-2025 Deer and Elk hunting Regulations. In general, I am pleased with the majority of the proposed regulations, particularly those in which we are reducing quotas and minimizing or eliminating antlerless harvest in areas where we have experienced declines in our mule deer populations.

Before I provide district specific comment, I would like to encourage the Commission and Department to revisit proposed regulation changes and evaluate the effectiveness of these regulation changes on a reoccurring interval in the future to analyze their effectiveness and or impact over time. I know the department does this every 2 years, when we revisit regulations, however, sometimes a regulation change may work for a number of years then outside circumstances change the dynamic on the landscape that would make the original regulation unapplicable but yet we continue with that regulation because it has become status quo. While I have seen this play out a number of times over the years the most glaring example of this the early rife hunt that we have in the Bob Marshall Wilderness. In 1936 MTFWP extended the general rifle season from 30 days to 75 day in an attempt to reduce elk numbers in the Bob Marshall because there were too many elk on the landscape for the available forage sources and overstocked winter ranges were leading to large scale winter die-offs of deer and elk. Fast forward to 2023 and the elk counts in the Bob Marshall, particularly the South Fork of the Flathead, are the lowest on record in the last 100 years and yet we are maintaining an early rifle hunt that was established as an attempt to reduce elk populations. I say that to encourage the Commission and Department to look back at regulation changes in the near term (which we commonly do) but then also in the long term to ensure the original intent of these changes is still valid so they don't become status quo in spite of circumstances changing.

CWD Management -Districts 199-20, 103-50, 699-20, 699-21

I understand the department is attempting to keep prevalence of CWD low ideally less that 5% in order to protect our big game populations. In the short term I can agree with our approach to CWD and would be in 100% agreement if our drastic efforts to reduce big game populations to reduce prevalence resulted in a long-term solution. Unfortunately, that is not the case, at the end of measure to reduce CWD, CWD is still on the landscape, and we are left with unhealthy low big game populations, which is essentially what we are trying to prevent in the first place. I understand the complexities with CWD and I also understand there really is no "good" solution. That said I do know that we have killed more deer in Montana in attempt to slow the spread of CWD than CWD has ever killed. In 103-50 deer densities are still extremely low in spite of there being a special district for mule deer bucks. Knowing how deer densities are a major driver in the transmission of CWD it is hard to not interpret the mandatory testing in 103-50 as an attempt to identify a positive CWD case and then use that as ammunition to eliminate that and other special mule deer districts. Because there are definitely areas in Montana that are higher risk without mandatory testing. Probably not the case, but that is the optics of the proposal without having a better long-term CWD plan in place. Districts 699-20&21- Do we have a good handle on what the winter of 2022-2023 did to the deer in these areas? Reports I am hearing from these areas are observing the lowest deer populations in recent history and yet we are proposing to further reduce populations. At what point is the population low enough to reduce the spread. Sure 0 deer would stop the spread but would also defeat the purpose. Also, in 699 the majority of the pressure from these additional tags would be put on public land, when the majority of the deer density issues that would potentially spread CWD are on private land. We should look towards reducing private land crowding first. Tough situation but let's look at where we are going long term before we deploy any nuclear options.

Elk B Tags- Districts 397-00, 322-00, 324-00, 360-00

I commend the department for making the Elk B-Tags in these districts valid on private land only not valid on National Forest Lands. I would like to see this approach taken statewide. There are no accessible public lands in Montana that I am aware of in Montana, that you could consider are over the carrying capacity for elk. Private lands, that is another story and yet the majority of our efforts to reduce elk populations are not placed on private lands, they are placed on public lands. Antlerless elk harvest used to be via permit and when you drew you could only shoot a cow (or at least that's the way it was in the areas I hunted) now we have B tags which are a second elk tag. So what do the majority of individuals do that have a B tag? They "fill the freezer" with a cow and then continue to hunt public land to harvest a bull. By switching away from the antlerless permit system we have essentially double the amount of elk tags in certain areas that are valid on public land, thereby significantly increasing the number of public land hunter days. What has this done? It has furthered our elk distribution issues in Montana, by creating too much pressure on public land that has led to additional

game depredation complaints on private land. All antlerless harvest on public land in Montana should be done by antlerless permits that require you to validate your general tag. B-Tags should be reserved for private land only to encourage pressure to be placed on the lands that are experience the bulk of the depredation issues. This would also eliminate the issues we are experiencing with over the counter B-Tags that are being purchased by non-residents creating unsustainable increases in public land hunting pressure. If non-residents want to come and hunt private land over the counter for antlerless that opportunity should be provided.

Proposal for HD417 limited entry Deer Permits (copied from fwp.mt.gov website)

*For the upcoming 2024-25 hunting season in hunting districts (HDs) 410, 411, 412, 417, 419, and 426, it is proposed to: • Change the mule deer general license regulation in HDs 410 and 417 from "Antlered Buck Only" (AB) to limited-entry (LE) permits for both 6-week archery and 5-week general seasons (quota 100, quota range 25-500);

As an outfitter in the 417 area for over 20 years my livelihood depends on the success and abundance of wildlife in our area and I see no need to include the northwestern portion of 417 into a limited deer permit. Outside of the fact that we have a strong deer population in our localized area, if this proposal goes through I will be out of business within a year as about 75% of our income is derived from mule deer hunting. I completely understand the need for limited deer permits on land east of the Stafford Ferry Road but no change in permitting is necessary on land west of the Stafford Ferry Road.

Quick Overview of HD 417

417 is a large hunting district with very diverse terrain and needs, and should be managed as such.

The eastern portion of the unit contains vast areas of accessible public land with limited agriculture (i.e. farmland/homesteads), deer numbers in the eastern portion have plummeted to dangerously low levels primarily due to drought, harsh winters, no supplemental feed (haystacks, shelterbelts, ect.), unlimited public access which has resulted in overuse and the encroachment of elk into what was historically mule deer range.

The northwestern portion of unit 417 is very different from the east. The northwestern portion is primarily private land and land-locked public with a higher concentration of farm fields, homesteads, and limited public access. The deer population in the northwestern portion of 417 is strong. It's not uncommon to see 75-100 deer a day while we are consistently harvesting older age class deer.

Simple Solution

Two years ago the northwestern boundary of HD417 was modified, moving the northwestern boundary from the Stafford Ferry Road further west to the PN Bridge Road. I would simply propose to revert back to the original boundaries as it was for many many years. Switching the northwestern boundary back to its original location of the Stafford Ferry Road would not only save the business I have been building for the last 22 years, it is also a commonsense point of division that separates two very different landscapes with different needs.

Of the statewide proposals, one I am very much opposed to is elimination of quota ranges for deer and elk. Quota ranges were established years ago so permit numbers could be adjusted within the quota range and not require approval of the Commissioners.

The following is why I object this proposal -

- 1. Every time an area biologist determines there is a biological need to adjust permit numbers, they would have to write a complete justification and get approval from the Commission.
- 2. Since this is usually done at the December Commissioner meeting, the area biologist would have to write and submit it prior to them conducting the winter deer and elk census flights nor have hunter harvest information.
- 3. The Commission has higher priority items to deal with rather than approve an adjustment of permits.
- 4. In my opinion, none of the three FWP wildlife biologists attending this meeting supported this change or could explain any benefits to eliminating deer and elk quota ranges.
- 5. I strongly support that FWP area wildlife biologists continue to establish permit numbers within the quota range without this extra burden. They are the most qualified to do this as they fly the census routes, review hunter harvest information, know the landowners, know the public access, and seek local public input.

I do support the hunting proposals for mule deer hunting in game management units 410, 411, 412, 417, 419, and 426 since their populations have been below the "long-term average" and justify restricted harvest measures.

Montana FWP:

Regarding the Region 5 archery-only either-sex elk permit, I support the continued aggregation of elk Hunting Districts 502, 535, 555, and 590 into one 595-21 archery-only either-sex elk permit. This aggregation allows archery elk hunters some flexibility in the areas they hunt (to avoid overcrowding), while still restricting the permit area to the eastern edge of Region 5. This regional 595-21 archery-only either-sex elk permit also allows archery hunters to hunt migratory elk in the Bull Mountains that cross Highway 12 frequently between Hunting District 535 and Hunting District 590.

However, for the 595-21 archery-only either-sex elk permit I would advocate that it truly be a "first and only choice" permit as advertised. Presently, the quota of 1,800 595-21 archery-only either-sex elk permits is set way too high and hundreds of permits go to the surplus drawing process each year. I would advocate that the 595-21 archery-only either-sex elk permit be administered as a real "first and only choice" permit, and that no leftover 595-21 archery-only either-sex elk permits go to the surplus drawing process to reduce overcrowding of archery elk hunters in elk Hunting Districts 502, 535, 555, and 590.

Regarding Region 5, I support the more restrictive mule deer doe harvest measures proposed, given that the Region 5 mule deer population is at rock bottom from a historical perspective. I would go even further and limit all mule deer doe hunting opportunities for several years (especially, in deer Hunting Districts 535, 555, and 590), given the dramatic decline in the mule deer population for Region 5. For Hunting District 535 I think the mule deer buck 535-50 permit quota should be reduced well below 500, given the dramatic decline in the mule deer population for this hunting district.

Finally, for all big game species I advocate for mandatory reporting of hunter harvest/success as a prerequisite for issuing the following year's applicable big game license/permit (as opposed to the current inaccurate and ineffective telephone survey methodology).

Accurate harvest/success and hunter distribution data is mandatory for effective deer and elk management decisions going forward.

Replacing the Single-Region Deer B Licenses for white-tailed deer with region-specific B licenses that allow hunters to purchase a regional specific Whitetail B License in more than one region is a proposal I support and is something that should have been done years ago for a number of reasons. I will mention two of them.

- With the general decline of mule deer across the state, there is a decrease in hunting opportunities for mule deer compared to past years. Making more opportunity for Single-Region Deer B Licenses for white-tailed deer would likely help fill the void created by that decrease as well as increasing overall hunter interest for white-tailed deer.
- The ability for hunters to purchase a Whitetail B License in more than one region may contribute to FWP's 3R efforts. Since white-tailed deer hunting opportunities are often more easily accessed by newer and younger hunters, (closer to towns, river bottoms vs. higher elevations etc.), Whitetail B License in more than one region could give the 3R audience more enthusiasm for continuing a hunting life.

If this proposal passes, I predict there will be a further increase in hunting pressure on Montana's white-tailed deer population. That said, it will become incumbent for regional game managers and area biologists to shift more of their time and attention to monitoring and managing white-tailed deer populations across their landscapes at least until mule deer populations recover and hunting trends reverse themselves.

Statewide

Eliminating quota ranges for all deer and elk permit license-permit types would be a serious mistake and is a proposal that I do not support.

These quotas serve as checks and balances, (maybe buffer would be a better term) against impulsive changes to permit licensepermit type numbers as directed by bureaucrats, politicians and others that have little for credentials for managing these kinds of things.

These proposals should be left on the cutting room floor. Let's keep the quota ranges. Management of local deer and elk populations needs to be done at the lowest level possible.

I think 410 should go to a limited entry and there should be a quota range set. The buck to doe ratio does not seem to be close to the desired ratio of >25 bucks:100 does. I seem to see a lot of small bucks getting harvested (smaller than 4 points) and the general quality of deer seems to have gone down especially in the past few years. A limited entry and quota range is needed for HD 410.

Reviewing through the proposed season and regulation changes, in general I like the changes. When it comes to some of the B tag changes for deer and elk, making more of them available for private land only seems like a great idea to help with more and more animals being pushed off of public lands and onto private.

I also like some of the proposed ideas for some of the HDs in Region 4 and moving east to change to draw units for Mule Deer bucks. I feel Mule deer numbers ebb and flow every few years and a great way to make sure we aren't over harvesting is to shift some units to draw only and to get rid of doe harvest. The only down side of that is all the people that usually hunt those units will simply spill over into neighboring over the counter units placing more pressure on them instead.

Several suggestions to continue moving in the right direction would first be to collect more information. The more information we have the greater chance we have of making informed decisions. Without mandatory reporting/checking regulations it is tough to know truly where everything is being harvested, where hunters are spending majority of their time, and what types of animals (sex and age class) are being harvested. I myself have personally been called multiple times over the years and purposefully not answered the phone because it is an unknown number and then be too busy to call back. Each year I am fortunate enough to harvest a bull or a buck and sometimes both. However, my information has rarely been collected.

The next general suggestion I have is to begin the serious contemplation of reducing out of state tags. It is a luxury that as a MT resident I get to hunt every year. This is something myself and majority of MT hunters hope to keep. However, the past several years have seen an influx in people moving to MT and therefore an increase of overall tags being provided and hunting pressure placed on public lands. To keep things balance to me the best option is to reduce the out of state tags being provided. MT is already very generous in the amount of tags allocated to out of state hunters when compared to other states. By reducing these numbers it will help to keep hunting pressure on public lands from rising out of control. I know the biggest argument against this change is the loss of money the state would see by decreasing out of state license sales. This could easily be offset but a small increase in resident hunting license costs.

On that note I have a couple different reports over the years for the number of resident vs non-resident tags sold in MT. To my point though, even if we throw in some random numbers and say 200,000 elk tags were sold last year. Of that there were 20,000 non resident tags. That leaves 180,000 residents buying licenses. If you cut the resident tag numbers by 20% that would be 4,000 less tags. To continue our hypothetical scenario going lets say (to keep it simple) each out of state tag cost \$500. So $4,000 \times 500 = 2$ million dollars. That may seem like a big loss. However, there are 180,000 residents still buying licenses. If you increased each resident license by just \$12, the state would actually profit \$160,000 while at the same time reducing public land pressure by 4,000 hunters.

It has been proposed to choose and "either/or" option for hunting either archery season or rifle season to help reduce hunting pressure. I think this would backfire and cause more people to hunt one season harder therefore spending increased time in the field which increases pressure. The solution I proposed above seems like a more straight forward suggestion to reduce public land pressure while at the same time actually increasing revenue for the state.

I really appreciate the opportunity you provide for the public to comment on these proposed changes. I hope you take our comments seriously and consider how much we care about this land and the animals that call it home.

My comment is primarily about 103-50 mandatory CWD testing and the 199-20 B license. How would FWP enforce mandatory CWD testing and what would the penalty be for not submitting samples for testing? The public has brought up the idea of mandatory testing for the 199-20 B tag years ago at a public meeting and I believe that one of the wardens in attendance or Neil Anderson, I can't remember which one said that the problem was lack of ability to enforce mandatory testing. I support mandatory CWD testing for both 199-20 and 103-50.

As far as limiting the number of 199-20 licenses to 1 per hunter, FWP isn't currently able to sell all 2000 199-20 licenses during the draw, and it ends up going to the surplus list as it is now, the problem I have with limiting the 199-20 to 1 per hunter is that people don't want their animals tested for CWD for several reasons, and if there was mandatory testing 199-20 license sales will decline. The reasons many people do not want their animals tested is multiple reasons.

First, the first year the 199-20 license was available, testing results took about 2 weeks after FWP took the sample, and local meat cutters would not allow an animal even hang in their cooler without a negative testing result, this resulted in many people leaving their animal to hang in 50+ degree weather for weeks and ultimately spoiled meat. Many meat cutters entirely stopped cutting deer and elk and some people started cutting their own meat, some people found people to cut the meat that don't require a negative test result. If they don't need the test result to get their meat cut, they don't get it tested.

Second is the disinformation that was distributed by elected officials and community members to gain support for legislation to issue moose tags the following year if a moose tests positive. People were told that it was mandatory to forfeit the meat and antlers to FWP upon receiving a positive CWD test result and many hunters refuse to have their animals tested because they don't want to give up the antlers. It was conveniently left out that surrendering the antlers is only necessary if a hunter wants a replacement license.

The third reason hunters don't want their animals tested for CWD is they believe that the workers at the CWD check station will start hunting where they hunt, and notellum creek will no longer be a secret.

For the current license year, how many people were actually able to purchase 7 199-20 licenses? Is the ability to harvest 7 whitetail bucks even a reality? Were all the licenses sold before they were available over the counter? Will FWP be able to sell all 2000 licenses if they limit them to 1 per person and require mandatory CWD testing?

I don't know if the proposed changes to the 199-20 B license will have the desired outcome.

I think in general that FWP should manage areas to reduce the spread of CWD where possible.

I strongly support the proposed change to the wording for muzzleloader use in the weapons restricted areas. I hunt with lead free projectiles for the most part and I am unable to legally do so in these weapons restricted areas where I hunt with a muzzleloader. Most of these areas are near wetlands, so the option to use lead-free projectiles could be beneficial to the habitat. Please allow this change to occur.

Also, for the sake of simplifying the regulations and avoiding confusion for hunters, I would like to suggest that Region 2 hunting districts: 260 and 290 be renamed "Weapons Restriction Area" instead of the current wording "Archery District". I would also like to suggest changing hunting district 262 to a weapons restriction area. I suggest following the example of other hunting districts such as: HD 309 and 388.

Currently, in hunting district 260, shotguns, handguns, muzzleloaders and crossbows are allowed for use with specific over-the-counter elk B licenses in the district. In the past, there have been deer B licenses also allowing these types of weapons in hunting district 260.

Hunting district 290 currently allows antlerless elk rifle hunting, as well as antlerless deer harvest with a specific B license in a large portion of the hunting district.

Hunting district 262 may be the most confusing hunting district in the state. During the general season, some species are limited to archery only, others are restricted to short range weapons and still others are allowed to be hunted with a rifle. This hunting district could be simplified, while still allowing opportunity and harvest without overharvest, by allowing it to be a weapons restriction area.

The use of these weapons seems to pose no threat to public safety during established seasons and are already allowed for many species in these hunting districts. Making these changes would help simplify the regulations and make things more uniform with the rest of the state and also clear to hunters. During the general rifle season in these districts, short range weapons, as defined in the hunting regulations could be used, and the traditional muzzleloader season could be added to these hunting districts for the specified dates in December.

The 313 to 314 boundary change: This is stupid; elk regularly cross back and forth across the Yellowstone - everyone who has ever spent time there knows this. This isn't a good idea from a hunter safety standpoint as the change would increase hunting opportunity in Beattie Gulch, which regularly has human-bear conflicts occur. This change would only increase the probability of human-bear conflicts and fatalities. For the sake of the some very naïve individuals who hunt, this boundary change should NOT occur. Additionally, if Montana has any hopes to delist grizzlies, the commission should be doing all it can to reduce management conflicts. These only piss off people opposed to delisting.

Concerning elk, telemetry data from FWP indicates that, "HD 313 elk telemetry data collected between 2007–2009 indicate that the elk population routinely crosses the Yellowstone River." which is where the proposed new boundary is to occur. Additionally, biologists state that, "The current boundaries of HD 313 are intended to encompass the winter range of the Northern Yellowstone elk population and use the same management structure on both sides of the Yellowstone River so that the herd is managed as a single unit. Adjacent elk herds that occupy the current HD 314 primarily winter in HD 314." If this change is adopted, the commission will continue to ignore work done by hired professionals to manage a species in the public trust. Biologists work hard to build public confidence and hunters want to see animals managed in a biologically sound way while allowing take: the point is to ensure future generations have the ability to hunt. As a commission, it is your job to trust and listen your biologists and it seems as though they don't see the purpose of this change. To me, that means there are ulterior motives by the commission to the boundary change. Montana used to be the gold-standard when it came to hunting regulations and this change would continue to strip hunting away from residents and public land hunters and work towards privatizing animals held in the public trust.

Finally, 314 is a GIANT unit that already has mid-unit restrictions to its regulations. Please reduce confusion for hunters and keep the unit as is.

The proposed reinstatement of the antlerless 313 non-youth b license seems questionable. "Although the northern Yellowstone herd's recruitment level does not warrant substantial antlerless opportunity, the population can sustain this level of antlerless harvest to provide for hunter opportunity...but subsequent public comment has suggested it is reasonable to reestablish this opportunity in the form of a B license." I realize that hunting regulations weigh both biological and social elements, but the biologist uses the higher survey count of the Northern Yellowstone herd from 2022 to justify the B-tag reinstatement while noting that, "Winter 2022-2023 was much harsher than other recent winters past....this likely increased the proportion of the herd which migrated north into MT last winter." I think the increased mortality and reduced recruitment due to winter severity should be taken into account before reinstating the b license. It's a really fantastic opportunity (particularly for local hunters!) but fully accounting for the effects of the winter (and thinking about why it was removed in the first place) should be considered before reinstatement.

I think the 397-000 b-tag is a great idea but would like to see whether the current 314 b tags are effective at their management purpose. Restricting almost all hunting opportunity to private land seems to be dangerously close to privatizing hunting.

Please consider the following comments regarding the proposed changes to the 2024/2025 Deer and Elk Regulations:

- 1) I concur with Chair Robinson's amendment to rescind the proposed increase in tags for Region 6 CWD areas. While action is needed, more public education and involvement is needed prior to a final decision and implementation.
- 2) As to the other changes for Region 4 and Region 6 (the areas I hunt), I concur with the proposed changes.

The following is my suggestion for improving hunter experience in selected areas:

The number of draw districts for bucks should be increased, especially for the districts around the CMR refuge and considered for most of Region 6. This is not only to reduce the number of non-resident hunters in these areas but to better manage populations in specific hunting districts. Currently, if a person wants to get a mule deer B tag they have to pick the HD they want to apply to. This ensures decent distribution of hunters across the landscape. Contrast this with A tags that allow an excess of hunters to congregate to a few HDs in eastern Montana with vast expanses of BLM, FWS, and type 1 block management. While it is easy to blame the non-resident hunters, I've seen plenty of 4/6/7/13 MT license plates in Valley County over the years also. While the deer population seemed to support this in years past, current harvest numbers and weather events seem to have tipped the scale disproportionately. While the motels and eateries in Glasgow, Malta, and Jordan no doubt benefit from the number of non-local hunters, it has led to increased resentment from locals due to increased competition for a limited resource.

I've hunted Region 6 for nearly 40 years and have hunted with friends and family from out-of-state for many of those years. Apart from the early 1990's when there were 1500 either sex antelope tags and over-the-counter doe/fawn tags for HD 630, the number of non-resident hunters always seemed to be "reasonable." We'd always see a few guys from Washington or Minnesota around the Fort Peck area. In the last 3 years, with the influx of resident MT hunters and caravans of hunters from Washington to the Glasgow area, the hunting experience has definitely declined.

My major concerns with the current hunting regulations is the overcrowding and over harvest which results from general seasons with no quota in hunting districts. I propose that the 7 regions be managed with deer quotas for both resident and non resident tags. I believe each hunting district within the regions should be allocated a specific quota of tags. The current system has no way of controlling hunting pressure in these popular areas such as SE Montana and the Missouri Breaks. I further would support a shorter season or a divided season where hunters choose the first half or the last half with reduced tags in the last half to reduce pressure on rutting mule deer and allow for an older age class to develop. I do not support the intense 5 week season on deer which is too long and has resulted in low deer numbers and very few mature bucks surviving each year.

I further support mandatory reporting of big game harvest to better manage wildlife and hunter numbers.

I strongly support the current special draws for elk and do not want these converted to a general tag. The special draws create a much better quality hunt and better age distribution of animals within these special draw units.

Looking through the proposals and opening up the Elk B tags in unit 3 sounds great, except for the added restrictions of making nearly all of them "Not Valid on National Forest" or private land only, a great example, currently 314 has a B tag that can be used during Archery or general season on national, but removing that takes away opportunities from a lot of hunters. I understand that elk congregate on less pressured private land, but the barriers to get access are great. If the goal is to manage the elk numbers and offer greater opportunity to sportsmen why are you putting all of the power into the hands of landowners? Every year it becomes harder and harder to get access. Case in point, last year the Red Bluff ranch in Norris MT owned by the State of Montana, somehow had restrictions put in place letting the ranch manager decide who is able to hunt there. He does not answer his phone or get back to you in a timely manner, and when he does the season is nearly over. On top of that they only allow on party of 2 in certain areas each day. This used to be an amazing opportunity for deer, elk, and bear but now this State owned parcel of nearly 10K acres is as restrictive as gaining permission to private property when it should be open to everyone in the state of Montana. The last one that does not make much sense is that you can not shoot cows in 310. Anyone looking at the migration report maps that have been done in the past can see that the majority of those elk make their way over to the Ennis area for the winter months. Once you hop the boundary to unit 360 (Ennis area) the new proposal has an Unlimited B tag for cows. Why would the opportunity not be there for a special draw 310 B tag that is available on national forest lands? All of these changes seem to be a step forward for landowners (especially the ones that charge for a cow hunt and we give the power to make that possible) but two steps backward for the sportsmen paying lots of money on tags, gear, travel, etc.

I'm in opposition of Commissioner Brooke's proposal to change the boundary of 313/314. I would like to see the amendment denied. I've been hunting 313 the last 10 years and wanted to reach out regarding the proposed boundary change for 313/314. Can you explain the motivation behind this with respect to protecting and preserving the greater yellowstone elk herd? Currently the herd sits at a 3.6 to 100 B:C ratio. I understand that based on FWP's "Science" the herd should not experience further reduced B:C ratios with this proposal. My engineering brain and many of my friends, family and colleagues that are highly educated and engaged in wildlife issues can't make sense of their logic because when all things remain the same but opportunity is increased we should only expect it to stay the same or further reduce. As a concerned sportsman, I don't think accepting a 3.6:100 B:C ratio on one of the most iconic herds in the country is acceptable. I'm very concerned with the state of the herd and believe the herd could be significantly healthier if we took the approach of further restricting opportunity rather than continue to try and take more.

Can we spend our energy proposing plans that would increase resources and funding to help study and manage the herd? A private aerial observation that can audit FWP's results and determine if there are improved methodologies to better predict the herds health. We seem to be doing the same thing year after year and expect different results.

Outfitters in the area take on a risk by hunting a migratory herd, some years it's great, some years it's tough. Clients and hunters need to understand that when booking their hunts. They are hunters and should understand it's not a guaranteed hunt. I'm also concerned for the MD populations in the area. Hellroaring outfitters has completely stopped offering mule deer hunts out of concern for the deer populations. I'm happy to see FWP has reduced doe tags to ~25 but it needs to be 0.

I'm so disheartened by FWP's and our commissioners' handling of our resources and when I see these types of amendments (Tabors last year, now this) where we're trying to increase pressure on the herd I have a really difficult time understanding what the motive is and what I'm missing. I think the herd is recovering nicely from the introduction of the wolves but the B:C ration is now way out of balance. The bison hunt last year was out of control and the amount of big six point bull elk in the back of tribal members trucks isn't helping the situation. I think that area could be one of the greatest hunts in the west if managed appropriately. I also think the youth cow hunt is a great way to introduce youth to hunting, if this amendment would offset that opportunity I think it's another gut punch to the public land hunter for the sake of putting more money in the pockets of outfitters.

My name is Bret Lian and I live in Jefferson City, Montana. I grew up in Clancy, Montana, only ten miles north.

I am writing to ask that you amend the proposal for 335 to add a portion description all the way south to Lump Gulch, where both mule deer bucks and does could be harvested on a general deer tag, to shrink that portion to the north. I propose moving it to the Lewis and Clark/Jefferson County line. This would still provide liberal mule deer harvest in thousands of acres of public land, but would not damage an already hurting deer herd by Clancy.

I spoke to the Region 3 Biologist Supervisor, and because there is not biologist currently employed for this area, he recommended I reach out not only to FWP but the my Commissioner.

10 years ago mule deer doe hunting was nixed in 335, and after reinstating antlerless hunting in 2016, by 2019 the quota was 25 due to, "poor recruitment for two years in a row and declines in estimated antlerless harvest." The fact of the matter is that during the 2022-2023 season-setting process - our most recent seasons -antlerless mule deer hunting with a B-license during the rifle season was totally eliminated in HD 335 because the population can't justify it – the biologist said so in her reports. It could not be clearer based on the data of the previous decade, that a wide-open mule deer harvest in a large chunk of 335 will do nothing but kick the herd while it's down, maybe worse.

I hunt this area, and my folks still live up Lump Gulch. I am telling you that mule deer on the slopes of Sheep Mountain and along Lump Gulch, have nothing to do with mule deer in Helena.

Just to simplify my points:

- -There are not that many deer in 335 as is, per the data.
- There are not that many deer in northern 335 where this expanded boundary would include
- -There is currently no biologist for this area, and it seems wrong to make this big change without the public being able to interact with them.
- -This proposal would be an aggressive management proposal in an area with very few deer due to an area 2 large divides and 4 drainages away from an area that has one.

I ask that you please move the boundary north to the county line, and not kick a herd while it's down in the name of an urban area nearly 10 miles away.

IV. Deer and Elk Seasons and Regulations

A. Region 3 Deer and Elk

Proposal: Reinstate HD 314 to Original Boundaries

MOGA Position: SUPPORT

Rationale for Change: The West side of Yellowstone River in Paradise Valley was historically part of HD 314 until the Gardiner Late Elk Hunt ended when Canadian Grey Wolves were introduced into Yellowstone Park.

Elk hunting in HD 313 takes place on the east side of the Yellowstone River of the river on primarily USFS lands. This area/hunt has a sorted past, Deckard Flats, the Firing lines along the Jardine Road, horseback charges over the backs of hunters on foot, shooting early, and tagging disputes create numerous conflicts for game wardens to resolve. Some of this activity spilled over onto USFS land in Beattie Gulch west of the river. The Commission has approved tools for the Department to respond to changing elk migration and afford needed protections for the NYH. In Cinnabar Basin and the Mol Heron drainage most of the accessible land is privately owned.

- 1) Resource Status. To what extent does this proposal address a conservation issue?

 The elk population in the area of concern to this proposal are recovering and a harvestable surplus exists without jeopardizing the herd.

 FWP assessment indicates that this proposed amendment is unlikely to have substantive biological effects on elk populations.
- 2) Hunting Opportunity/To what extent does the proposal address hunter opportunity?

 Existing regulations unnecessarily limit hunting opportunities to the three-week season. By reinstating HD 314 to its original boundaries will increase hunting opportunity for elk. There may be some adjustment to by reducing HD 313 youth B licenses to 25 and the B licenses for hunters of any age to 25, with no change to the proposed guota range
- 3) Hunter Distribution/To what extent does the proposal address hunter distribution and crowding
 By reinstating HD 314 to its original boundaries, will afford greater opportunity and greater area for hunters to hunt, thereby affecting hunter distribution in other areas in a positive way. This is a key theme that came from the public scoping and comment period.
- 4) Economic Impacts to Local and Regional Economies. Will the proposal have a positive or negative impact on local and regional economies?

Passage of this proposal will allow the communities of Gardiner and some outfitting businesses to recover from the unnecessary loos of two weeks of the general season. Passage of this proposal will positively affect the local and regional economy.

- 5) Diversity of Hunting Opportunity. To what extent does the proposal add to or remove diverse hunting opportunities/experiences. While this proposal does increase sustainable hunting opportunity, it does not alter the diversity of hunting opportunity.
- 6) Landowner Concerns. To what extent does the proposal address a stated landowner concern or issue?

There is landowner interest in moving that portion of formerly HD 314, now included in HD 313, back to HD 314. Landowners are frustrated that the limitations in HD 313 are applying to the west side of the river, precluding the opportunity to take antlerless elk and control problematic elk. The landowners who have signed our petition are not facing the overcrowding issues that exist east of the river. What we have is cow elk in our bottom land all year round. We would like to allow hard working neighbors to come in and shoot a cow to put meat in the freezer. But there are no cow tags in 313 and local meat hunters are forced to put pressure on the rag horn bull population when they get off work. We would like to be returned to area 314 so we could harvest cows.

The landowners who support this proposal own over 14,000 acres which were moved out of area 314 and into Area 313 to address Yellowstone Park's concerns about wolf and bison management.

Most proposals seem to make sense. My thoughts focus mostly on Region 1, since I grew up close to Troy and still live in the area. I would say some bigger changes and tweaks are needed here for big game management. Numbers of animals in general are way down, it's no secret. I assume that's why some folks have been contacted to help trap wolves for collaring and tracking to try and figure out why the elk population is down by 70%, (I believe that's for Sanders County). It would seem that no elk b licenses in R1 would make perfect sense. Shorten archery and rifle seasons to 30 days. Cap the non-resident tags available like some other states do. Obviously, some people will cry foul about it, but common sense says if something is off by 70%, some changes need to be made, correct? Make elk 6 pt or better (preferably) or 5 pt at minimum. Mule deer 3 pt or better. It's true, it would be even worse than it is now, which is not good anyway, for 3-4 years or so, but after that I think, the benefit would start becoming evident. Used to see two or three big bull elk every year, now lucky to see a big one in 5 or 6 years.

Multiple licenses for either-sex whitetail seem pretty silly as well. A person shouldn't be allowed more than one buck per year. Glad to see CWD mandatory testing proposal. Mandatory testing should be in order for all deer, elk, and moose harvests in the state. I'm sure CWD is currently present in areas not yet identified as well. On the predator side of things, allow a spring bear tag and fall bear tag, for a total of 2 potential bear harvest per season if a person is into that. Overabundance of bears up here, just like areas across the border in Idaho. Maybe the fall tag has a reduced price? I would say there's probably more potential issues and options to be brainstormed, but some tough decisions probably need to be made for R1 to improve conditions. It definitely isn't going to happen by keeping the status quo. Never going to be able to make everyone happy, but it would sure be nice to see an effort made to improve conditions. Thank you for taking the time to read my thoughts on the matter.

RE: Objection to combining western portion of HD 313 with HD 314

Dear Commissioner Brooke and all Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks Commissioners,

I am writing on behalf of the Park County Rod and Gun Club, a local grassroots sportsmen and women organization with over 2,000 members located primarily in Park, Gallatin, and Sweet Grass Counties. I want to express our club's concerns and objection to the proposal, currently before the Montana Fish Wildlife and Parks (MT FWP) Commission, that would combine the portion of Hunting District (HD) 313 that lies west of the Yellowstone river with adjacent HD 314. We want to provide input on this matter because it is of significant importance to our community, the management of the northern Yellowstone elk herd, and management of wildlife resources in general.

Our objection to the proposal stems from our position that the biological data supports managing the northern Yellowstone elk herd as one population. Splitting HD 313 into two units will have adverse effects on the elk population when one portion of the herd is managed with biological science and the other portion is managed with economics. It is worth noting that while the western portion of HD 313 was previously included in HD 314, it has historically been managed in conjunction with HD 313. Altering this historical management approach could disrupt the delicate balance of the elk population, habitat, and hunter objectives.

Furthermore, we would like to bring to your attention the importance of a transparent and inclusive review process. If the MT FWP Commission intends to accept and review proposals submitted by private parties, we recommend implementing a formal review process that allows sportsmen and women to view non-Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks proposals under consideration and provide comment.

We have reviewed the agenda and recordings of past MT FWP Commission meetings and have not found any record of this proposal being addressed in any public forum. As it stands, had members of the Park County Rod and Gun Club not participated via Zoom in the November 2nd FWP season setting meeting, we would have been unaware of the HD 313 proposal, potentially resulting in a lack of crucial public input. This does not reflect well on the ability of the MT FWP Commission to address the needs of the general and atlarge Montana resident hunter. Managerial decisions, across Montana, should be made with careful consideration of historical data, the biological needs of the wildlife, and the valuable input from all local stakeholders.

Thank you for your time and consideration of our concerns. We look forward to the MT FWP Commission rejecting this proposal and addressing the complexities of this issue with a public process that allows for sportsmen and women input. The Park County Rod and Gun Club would encourage the MT FWP Commission to establish public meetings on this subject, and any other private proposals, to which we would send representatives and provide input. We would also offer our resources to help organize any meetings.

In closing, the Park County Rod and Gun Club has concerns about overcrowding in HDs adjacent to HD 313 (317, 314), which can potentially be attributed to early closure of HD 313. This proposal may anecdotally address this issues, however, we ask the MT FWP Commission to reject it out right and any other proposals that have not been part of a public review process.

This is supported by data provided by the regional office showing a 100% increase in non resident hunting pressure over the last 5 years as well as a 100% increase in total hunter days among residents and nonresidents. We eventually have to address the fact that the total numbers of hunters on the landscape is on a trajectory that is not sustainable and at this point, I would strongly support ANY change to help distribute pressure across the state. The most logical and simple solution would be to implement a regional cap on nonresidents across the state, distributing the 17,500ish Big Game combos amongst the regions like most other states already do.

I also do not support the removal of the quota ranges from the regulation booklet. This is a prime example of "don't fix something if it isn't broken." All the removal does is add one more bureaucratic hurdle for managers to jump over when changes are needed. If transparency in the draw regarding the quota is what's needed, I suggest placing a stronger emphasis on the fact that it is a proposed quota and not final until aerial surveys are completed.

I do not support the amendment by Commissioner Brooke.

To Whom It May Concern:

I submit the following comments on behalf of Hellgate Hunters & Anglers, a Western Montana-based organization that represents over 500 sportsmen and women across the state. We are grateful for the opportunity to comment on the 2024-2025 Season Setting Draft Regulation Proposals for Region 2 and statewide. As part of this process, we greatly appreciate the detailed explanations and justifications from the area biologists for the proposed changes in each district, and we hope this remains an integral part of the season setting process. In addition, while we appreciate the Department's efforts to solicit public comment and hold public meetings statewide during the summer of 2023 to gather input from Montana citizens, we'd encourage FWP to adjust the timing of the public comment window. It's unrealistic to expect much of the hunting public to provide feedback and/or attend public meetings on proposed regulations during general season for big game, but a slightly earlier start (perhaps during the week between archery and rifle seasons) would provide for a more meaningful and robust public process.

HHA submits the following comments regarding the draft proposals for Region 2:

Elk

- We encourage FWP to maintain restrictions in HD 201 and limit B license harvest east of HWY 93. This population has yet to fully recover, and B license opportunity is inappropriate at this time.
- We support the addition of more antlerless elk opportunities in HD 204.
- We support the addition of another antlerless elk permit for private lands in HD 210.
- We support the change to move cow elk opportunities to a permit instead of a general license in HD 217.
- We support the addition of rifle bull elk limited quota for HD 262 and ask that the Department continue its work to expand public hunting opportunities within this district. Harboring of elk is a significant issue in this district, and this opportunity will hopefully redistribute late season bulls from private to public lands.
- We oppose a further increase in the number of 270-01 B-licenses. This is the second quota increase in as many years and may indicate that more tags (without more access) is not having the desired impact on elk populations.
- We remain opposed to the addition of a limited HD 281 B-license opportunity because data indicates this population has not experienced a significant recovery and may still be in decline.

Deer

· We support the elimination of antlerless mule deer B-licenses in HD 240 and ask that the Department continue and expand its

study of mule deer declines in Western Montana.

- We support the reduction in mule deer buck tags in HD-260.
- We take no issue with reducing the general season dates for either sex whitetail deer tags in some districts but encourage the Department to ensure these changes are adequately noticed to prevent confusion.

Bighorn Sheep

• We support all the draft proposals for sheep hunting opportunities in Region 2, and thank the Department for its responsiveness to population declines. While we understand the need for population control, risk of disease contact, and other safeguards regarding the East Fork herd, we would implore the department to explore opportunities for additional transplants in lieu of ewe hunting opportunities.

HHA submits the following comments for the statewide regulation proposals:

- HHA is concerned with proposals to 'eliminate quota ranges for all permit license-permit types' for elk and deer. This proposal could lead to drastic increases (or reductions) in limited-entry permit districts. We ask that the quota ranges for both deer and elk permit license-permit types be kept in place to provide sideboards and allow for the appropriate input from FWP's biologists.
- We strongly support antlered buck only hunting opportunities in those hunting districts where mule deer populations are in decline. This should be a governing principle for deer management in our state, and not subject to the whims of the hunting public. We are witnessing a severe decline in the quality of Montana's mule deer hunting opportunities, which already ranked below those of our neighboring states.
- HHA supports eliminating significant opportunity for non-resident doe hunting, as lined out in SB 281 from 2023. We encourage FWP to err on the side of resource protection than hunter opportunity. When and where appropriate, FWP has the authority to void any antlerless licenses that may have already been issued and issue refunds. We encourage this in areas where winter kill has been especially harsh on mule deer.

Thank you again for the opportunity to comment. We look forward to continuing to engage in the season setting process.

With the absence of doe harvest, every little buck with bone on its head gets shot at. The whitetail population has been decimated. Our buck/doe ratio is seriously out of wack. Any given day of the week, you count 3-400 deer between the highway at Buffalo and Buffalo Canyon. Most of them being on our place and our adjoining neighbors. Talking with the neighbors, we would really like to see a point restriction to protect the smaller bucks.

I have spoke to many of our hunters this year, and most said they would like to see the doe harvest opened as they would gladly shoot a doe before a young buck. We have been dealing with this for 7-8 years when we first met with FWP Jay Kolby. Nothing has changed. We all feel that FWP has really dropped the ball managing this herd. There is a difference in managing and protecting deer. At this point, it seems that Fwp is only interested in PROTECTING as many deer as possible, not MANAGING a Healy balanced herd.

As a hunter who routinely hunts HD270, I agree with the premise of this change to simplify the regulations, move elk off of private land, and maintain population objectives. However, I am concerned about the chaotic situations that I believe will inevitably occur on the Lazy J Cross, which is already a highly competitive and pressured location. Validating Elk B License 262-01 for this area would significantly increase hunting pressure on the Lazy J Cross.
