Region 3 and specifically Wolf Management Unit 313 are different from all other regions in the state of Montana. This area contains the vast majority of guide services and businesses that serve clients who want to view wolves in the wild. The closer you get to Yellowstone National Park the positive impact of wolves for the tourism industry increases and the negative impact of wolves on the livestock industry decreases. In this unique zone adjacent to YNP (WMU 313) the wolf is a valuable economic and social asset. Excessive harvest in this zone is detrimental for the economy in the area surrounding Gardiner, Montana.

There are several rules in the current Montana wolf hunting and trapping regulations that in combination could kill or irreparably harm entire packs of YNP wolves. Because one hunter can harvest as many as 10 wolves and combined with shooting over bait and using night vision scopes, one or two skilled marksman with silenced rifles can kill many wolves in one shooting event. When one pack is removed or dramatically impacted it has a negative effect on overall wolf pack stability within the Park. When wolf packs are destabilized in this region, correspondingly wolf watching businesses are also impacted. A mass wolf shooting event may have already occurred in 2021/22 with the elimination of the Phantom Lake Pack.

The Brooke Amendment will revive two Wolf Management Units (WMU 313/WMU 316) on the border of YNP. This would prevent the entire quota of 6 from being focused on a limited geographic area. It would also be less likely that one single wolf pack would be decimated by a concentrated shooting event. This Amendment would lower the negative impact of excessive transboundary mortality on Yellowstone wolves. The Brooke Amendment would also decrease the negative impact that Montana's wolf season has on the local community that relies on wolf viewing for their winter economy. Please approve the Brooke Amendment.

For 20 years we have been avid wolf watchers in Yellowstone National Park. This season (2023/24) we spent 14 days in the Park and had 7 nights of Lodging. On those overnights there were additional expenditures of dinners, groceries and gasoline. As Montana residents we contribute to the 80 million winter economy associated with wolf watching in YNP.

Once again the local economy and YNP wildlife viewing is under threat from excessively high quotas in WMU 313. Because of the high quota and the "anything goes" Montana wolf hunting regulations, there were an extraordinary number of wolves poached after the official end of wolf hunting season. WMU 313 was closed on December 27, 2023 after reaching the legal limit of 6 YNP wolves. At least 3 probably more YNP wolves were killed after that, this exceeds the intended harvest by at least 150%. The Commission must reduce the quota for WMU 313 to curb this illegal harvest. I request a quota for WMU 313 for next year to be an absolute minimum of 4.

If the Commission is resistant to lowering the quota for WMU 313, the Brooke Amendment is an excellent comprise. The Brooke Amendment would redistribute the wolf kills more evenly along the entire border of Montana and YNP. The Commission does have responsibility for protecting the economy in the Gardiner region from over harvest of Yellowstone wolves and the Brooke Amendment would help in that regard. Please approve the Brooke Amendment.

Thank you for the work you do and for the opportunity to submit comments on the 2024–Winter 2025 Furbearer and Wolf Trapping and Hunting Seasons and Quotas. Large Carnivore Fund is headquartered in Region 3 WMU 313, Gardiner, Montana.

I. Revert back to two separate WMUs (313 and 316 previous boundaries) with a quota of no more than three wolves per unit. We support FWP Region 3 Commissioner Brooke's amendment and Yellowstone National Park's June 26, 2024 (N1615/1.A.2.(YELL) recommendations, to revert back to two separate WMUs (313 and 316 previous boundaries) with a quota of no more than three wolves per unit, e.g. three in 313 and three in 316. If the motion is to retain the one large WMU 313 then reduce the total quota to no more than four wolves due to the high mortality. This could significantly improve wolf management and reduce impacts on Yellowstone National Park's iconic wolves.

Since Wolf Management Units 313 and 316 were changed from two separate WMUs to one WMU 313, and the quota set to six, the wolves killed have been concentrated near the Yellowstone Park Boundary by Gardiner,

- 1. All six wolves harvested in FWP WMU 313 were from Yellowstone packs
- a. Three uncollared wolves from 1386F's group;
- b. Two uncollared wolves from Lupine Creek pack;
- c. One radio-collared wolf from Mollie's pack;

In addition to the quota of wolves killed,

- 2. Two radio-collared wolves were harvested from Yellowstone packs in Region 3 near the WMU 313 boundary:
- a. One from the Lupine Creek pack
- b. One from a newly formed pair 1330F/1336M group;
- 3. One radio-collared breeding male wolf from Lupine Creek pack died in early February 2024 from a poaching incident in WMU 313;
- 4. Two more radio-collared Yellowstone wolves died during the wolf hunting season (one inside Yellowstone, another adjacent to the boundary) suspected to have died from gunshot wounds sustained in WMU313, but investigation could not provide certainty.

In total the 2023-2024 season mortalities resulted in the dissolution of three Yellowstone packs that counted toward the 2023 park population.

My name is Hunter Graham. I am a (nearly) lifelong resident of the Cooke City Silver Gate area. I grew up leading horseback riding tours in Yellowstone, and am currently a wildlife guide for Silver Gate Guides, an environmental education service that specializes in private wolf and grizzly bear watching tours.

I am commenting to show my support for proposed changes in wolf hunting regulations brought forth by Commissioner Brooke. I believe that by returning HD 313 to a two-unit framework and reducing the harvest quota altogether, wolf mortality would be better distributed, reducing destabilizing effects on wolf populations that spend most of their time in Northern Yellowstone. There is hard science to support this; Harvest of Yellowstone wolves has been shown to negatively impact pack persistence and pup production. Ironically, the indiscriminate harvest of key pack members can actually cause increased reproduction in certain wolf populations, resulting in human-enhanced reproduction, which is also undesirable.

My livelihood, and that of many others in Yellowstone's gateway communities depends greatly on consistency of wolf watching opportunities along the Northern Range. Wolf watching in the GYE brought over \$80 million to local economies in 2022, and Park visitation and interest in wildlife is increasing annually.

Furthermore, currently wolf harvest regulations may be construed as antithetical to Fair Chase, a fundamental goal of the North American model of conservation. Prohibitions on baiting, night hunting, and the use of telemetry should be reinserted in to your regulations.

Dear Commissioners and Staff,

I'm a Gallatin County resident and writing to urge you to eliminate wolf hunting and trapping near Gardiner in unit 313.

There is no reason for wolves who spend the majority of their lives in a Yellowstone National Park to be killed when they leave it. Yes, wolves move across the landscape, but these wolves live in the vicinity of tourists and there's evidence that wolves who leave Yellowstone are especially vulnerable to being hunted: "Wolves that dwell in the park see scores of people, and that can lead to habituation and brazen behavior." (Mike Koshmrl, "Yellowstone hazes its habituated wolves, and it works," Jackson Hole News & Guide (Apr. 21, 2021).) Hunting, trapping, and snaring should not be allowed for wolves who spend most of their lives in Yellowstone National Park, wearing tracking collars, not engaging in depredation, and possibly habituated to humans.

Further, the quota is not working. Even with a quota of six wolves in this area, 11 wolves were killed last year—almost all of them from Yellowstone-based packs. As a result of last season's wolf mortality, the social structure of at least three Yellowstone packs were disrupted, resulting in the dissolution of those packs. As Yellowstone Wolf Project lead biologist Dan Stahler recently told WyoFile, the NPS mission in Yellowstone is to "protect and preserve natural processes—including natural social dynamics." (Mike Koshmrl, "Yellowstone superintendent seeks hunting relief for wolves after another deadly winter," Idaho Capital Sun (July 19, 2024).)

Wolf hunting benefits only the few who engage in it—and we know this is not subsistence hunting. Conversely, living wolves create abundant economic benefit for rural communities near the Park. A recent University of Montana study indicated that wolves accounted for nearly a 4% increase in annual Park visitation and millions of dollars in extra in annual visitor spending for the Greater Yellowstone area—a place I live and want to prosper. While all wolves have more value alive than dead, these wolves in particular carry more than \$82 million in economic value for rural Montana communities near the Park. ("Greater Yellowstone Wildlife Related Activity Valuation Study," RRC Associates & Institute for Tourism and Recreation Research 27–29 (2022).) It makes no economic sense to continue to allow Yellowstone's wolves to be hunted and trapped.

Please reinstate the minimum quota allowed by law.

Further, I strongly suggest following the suggestions of Yellowstone Superintendent Cam Sholly to reinsert the prohibition on the use of telemetry for hunting (MCA 87-6-401) and prohibit baiting and night hunting on private lands. (Letter from Cameron H. Sholly, Yellowstone Superintendent to the Montana Fish and Wildlife Commission (June 26, 2024).) The 2021 Montana State Legislature went too far by passing extreme unfair-chase, anti-wolf measures that do not align with the values of most Montanans. Again, because a significant portion of Yellowstone wolves wear tracking collars, they could potentially be located by unfair-chase hunters who possess very-high frequency receivers. There's no legislative mandate that prohibits you from changing those rules and bringing them back in line with Montana values.

A recent University of Montana study indicates that GYE wolves bring more than \$82 million in economic value to rural Montana communities near the Park.
