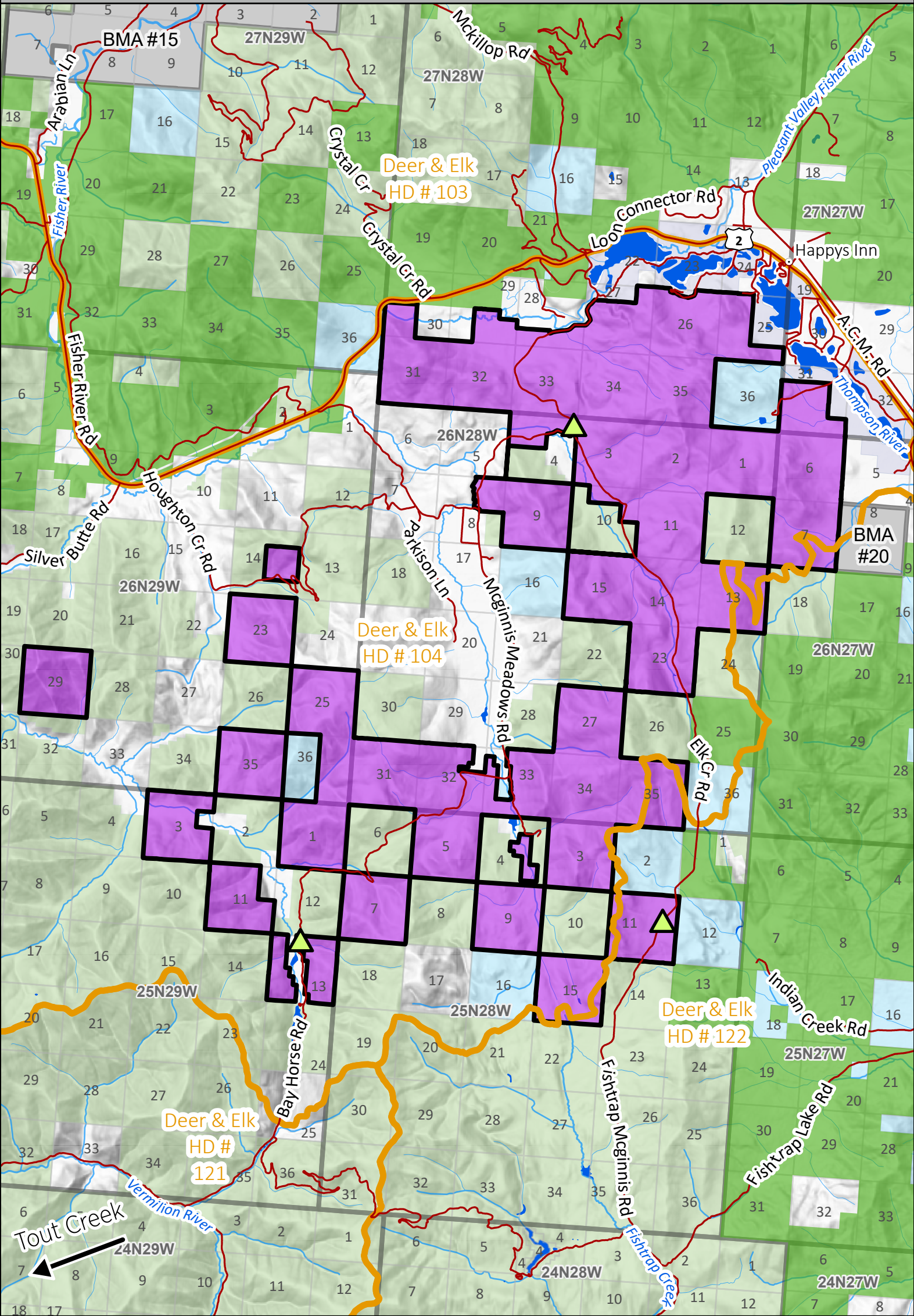

SPP Montana LLC, a private company, in partnership with MT Fish, Wildlife & Parks (FWP) Region 1, welcomes the responsible use of its lands by the public for noncommercial recreation such as hunting, fishing, and camping.

HUNTING OPPORTUNITIES:

The following species may be hunted on this BMA with valid licenses:

White-tailed & mule deer, elk, moose, upland bird, black bear, turkey, bighorn sheep, waterfowl, mountain goat

SPECIAL PERMISSION IS REQUIRED FOR ALL TRAPPING AND HUNTING of any species not listed above, including wolves and mountain lions. Permission for additional species and trapping must be obtained by emailing: houndsandtrapping@sppland.com

PERMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Season-long permission is required before accessing the BMA.
- Permission details can be obtained from a sign-in box (see map for locations) or the Region 1 FWP headquarters office.
- Effective **September 1, 2026**, all BMA users must obtain and display a **Yellow Season-Long Permission Hang Tag** on their vehicle’s rearview mirror at all times.
- The correct permission hang tag must be displayed from vehicle rearview mirror at all times while accessing the SPP MT McGinnis BMA.

RULES

- Campfires and fireworks are prohibited. Propane fire pits are allowed.
- Setting up trail cameras is prohibited.
- Target and/or recreational shooting is prohibited. Discharge of firearms is limited to legal hunting, as regulated by state laws.
- Trail building or construction of any permanent structures is prohibited.
- All commercial activity is prohibited without additional permission by SPP.
- Firewood cutting is allowed by permit only. Cutting of standing trees is prohibited.
- Drone operation on SPP Montana lands is prohibited.
- Pack out all garbage and leave the area clean. Littering is prohibited.
- No dumping of carcasses.
- Permission is required for special events or gatherings. Email vlamb@sppland.com to inquire.
- Fish & Wildlife Commission-approved regulations apply. Hunters are required to possess the necessary hunting licenses for the area and species they are hunting.

CAMPING

- Camping is limited to 7 days per campsite. Campsites must not be left unattended for more than three consecutive days.
- Campfires are prohibited. Propane fire pits are allowed.
- Pack out **ALL** garbage and leave the area clean.

ROAD RESTRICTIONS

- Motorized vehicle use is restricted to open public roads. All other motorized vehicle use is prohibited. Motorized vehicle use behind gates or off road is prohibited. This includes motorcycles, **e-bikes**, snowmobiles, 4-wheelers, ATVs, OHVs, UTVs.
- Road use is restricted with gates, barricades, earthen barriers and/or signs. These restrictions may be on roads owned by SPP Montana or on roads that are cooperatively managed with adjacent landowners. Cooperative road management signs indicates the intended restriction.
- Walking, use of non-motorized bicycles, and riding horses are allowed behind gates and barriers.
- A gate, whether opened or closed, with no signage stating otherwise, remains a year-round closure to all motorized vehicles.
- Road restrictions apply behind unmarked gates, even if the gate is vandalized or open.
- An earthen barrier is considered a closure to all motorized vehicles. Exception: Snowmobiles are allowed between December 1 and April 1. Snowmobiles must stay on designated roads.
- Earthen barriers must not be compromised.
- Gates must not be blocked. Administrative, contractor or emergency traffic may need to pass through.
- Accessing or transportation of others or game behind road closures with any vehicle is prohibited.
- No discharge of firearms within the roadway of any road open to use by the public for motorized travel.

FAILURE TO ABIDE BY THESE RULES MAY RESULT IN EVICTION FROM THIS PROPERTY AND/OR A CITATION FOR VIOLATION OF FWP COMMISSION ADOPTED RULES.
