## Flathead Lake State Park

## Position



**Term of service:** June 14, 2021 – November 19, 2021

**Service schedule:** Member will serve a minimum of 915 hours over a 23-week term, averaging 41 hours per week with 40 hours of “Time Not Scheduled to Serve” to be used as sick, vacation, or other personal leave.

### **Position Summary:**

As the largest, natural, freshwater lake west of the Mississippi, Flathead Lake provides some of the best water-based recreational opportunities in the western United States, including fishing, camping, hiking, sightseeing, wildlife-viewing, and boating. Because of its world-class recreational opportunities, Flathead Lake State Park receives over 300,000 visitors annually. With six state park units located around the lake, the park includes Wayfarers, Yellow Bay, Big Arm, Finley Point, West Shore, and Wild Horse Island—the only island state park in the Montana State Park system. At over 2,000 acres, Wild Horse Island is home to bighorn sheep, mule deer, waterfowl, bald eagles, and falcons, as well as five wild horses.

This AmeriCorps position will be housed out of the Flathead Lake Ranger Station located in Flathead Lake State Park – Wayfarers unit on the south side of Bigfork, Montana. Bigfork is a quaint, charming lakeside village with all the amenities of a larger town, conveniently located near world-class hiking, skiing, rafting, and fishing.

The AmeriCorps member will be exposed to a variety of experiences at Flathead Lake State Park. The main project will consist of developing and leading a variety of guided hikes and evening programs throughout the park. They will increase volunteer capacity by recruiting volunteers to the parks and hosting projects with volunteers to improve park land. In addition, the member will continue developing a relationship with Bigfork and Polson Schools. The member will develop skills in park improvement and management by working on the trail systems and other projects. The member will also identify opportunities for future programs, events and interpretive displays throughout the Flathead Lake State Park.

Communities in Action Corps members perform capacity building activities. Their service revolves around the program goals listed below in order to ensure that they do not displace workers or take part in any prohibited or unallowable activities as outlined in AmeriCorps regulations. Communities in Action Corps members *will* likely participate in activities that involve recurring contact with vulnerable populations.

**Member will contribute to the following program goals:**

- Improve park land
- Expand educational and interpretive programs
- Increase volunteer capacity\*
- Enhance outreach and awareness of state parks
- Participate in service activities including National Days of Service\*\*
- Respond to disasters, when called upon to do so by the program

**Specific Position Responsibilities:**

- Improve park land
  - Coordinate at least one volunteer workday
- Expand educational and interpretive programs
  - Develop and lead a variety of guided hikes and evening programs
  - Lead a Summer Junior Ranger series focusing on relevant STEM topics, such as geology, marine biology, and wildlife management, and expand educational programming with the Bigfork and Polson School Districts
- Increase volunteer capacity
  - Help recruit and build a core group of community volunteers
  - Coordinate at least two separate volunteer events, and assist with planning a volunteer appreciation event.
- Enhance outreach and awareness of state parks
  - Lead Flathead Lake State Park's social media efforts
  - Develop posters advertising volunteer events and programs

**Minimum Requirements:**

- Over 18 with a high school diploma or GED; college degree or equivalent work experience preferred
- A United States citizen, United States National, or legal permanent resident alien
- Demonstrated leadership skills
- Ability to take initiative, handle multiple projects, track details essential to project completion, analyze information, and meet deadlines
- Strong ability to communicate effectively orally and in writing with diverse groups of people
- Demonstrated ability to work independently and as part of a team
- Basic computer proficiency
- Passion for the outdoors and enthusiasm for enhancing Montana's state parks
- A driver's license and personal means of transportation within the state of Montana
- Must pass the requirements of the National Service Criminal History Check

**Benefits:**

- Living allowance of \$7,475 over 23-week term of service (\$325/week)
- Health Insurance
- An AmeriCorps Education Award of \$3,097.50 upon successful completion of service. This award can be used to pay education costs at qualified institutions of higher education, for educational training and resources, or to repay qualified student loans. Members aged 55 and over may transfer the education award to a child, grandchild or foster child.
- Eligible for deferment on qualified student loans
- Experience and training working in the fields of outdoor recreation, parks management, interpretive services, education, community outreach, and volunteer management
- Opportunity to live, work and be part of the team amid the natural wonders and cultural heritage of Montana State Parks

**Application Deadline:**

Applications are due by April 22, 2021.

Volunteer activity facilitated by AmeriCorps members supports the management and operation of State Parks. These activities do not include any prohibited or unallowable activities as outlined in AmeriCorps regulations.

Service activities will center around the preceding program goals as well as provide unique opportunities for members to engage in service to non-profit community organizations that provide support to those in need, including victims of national disasters, individuals and families in poverty, veterans, homeless animals, and other groups. Service projects will take place on and around designated National Days of Service as well as other AmeriCorps organized events, such as member trainings. Service activities will not include any prohibited or unallowable activities as outlined in AmeriCorps regulations.

Communities in Action Corps shall provide equal access to opportunities provided our program and shall not discriminate against any person because of race, creed, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, physical or mental disability, sexual orientation, or gender identity.
